Herbert, Attorney General of the State of Ohio, pursuant to the duties imposed upon me under the provisions of section 4785-175 of the General Code of Ohio, hereby certify that, in my opinion, the attached summary is a fair and truthful statement of the proposed amendment to amend the Constitution of the State of Ohio by adding a new section to Article XII relative to the appropriation and use of revenues accruing from any tax or fee for the registration, ownership, or operation of motor vehicles and from any tax on gasoline and other motor vehicle fuels and lubricants used in motor vehicles."
