

relating to the proposed sale and conveyance of certain abandoned Ohio Canal lands in the City of Newark, Ohio, which are more particularly described as follows:

"Being that portion of the abandoned Ohio Canal property in said City of Newark that is included in a 12-foot strip of canal land as owned by the State of Ohio on the northerly side of said canal beginning at a line drawn at right angles to W. O. Sanzenbacher's transit line of his survey of said canal property, and extending thence westerly including the full width of said 12-foot strip, a distance of 450 feet, more or less, to the inner face of the easterly abutment of the Canal Aqueduct over Raccoon Creek and containing fifty-four hundred square feet, more or less.

Also a right-of-way twelve feet wide extending diagonally across Raccoon Creek to the line of the inner face of the westerly abutment of said aqueduct, produced, 160 feet, more or less, and containing 1920 square feet, more or less. Said right-of-way being for pipe-line purposes only."

From said transcript it appears that you propose to sell and convey the above described parcels of land to A. H. Heisey and Company of Newark, Ohio, for the stated consideration of four hundred and fifty dollars (\$450.00).

Upon examination of this transcript, I find that the same contains by way of recital, or otherwise, a statement of all of the facts necessary under the provisions of section 13971 and other relating statutes to authorize the sale of this property at private sale.

I am accordingly approving, as to legality and form, your proceedings relating to the sale and conveyance of this property as is evidenced by my approval endorsed upon said transcript and upon the duplicate copy thereof, all of which are herewith returned to you.
