"The acts of an officer de facto, when questioned collaterally, are as binding as those of an officer de jure."

To the same effect is the case of *Greenlee* vs. Cole, 113 O. S. 585, 589. It is therefore evident that said judgments cannot now in any way be attacked since no objection was made by any of the parties to the actions at the time of the rendition of the judgments.
