APPROVAL—CONTRACT FOR COMPLETION OF ELECTRICAL WORK FOR PROJECT KNOWN AS STATE HIGHWAY GARAGE BUILDING, CLEVELAND, OHIO, \$4,935.00, MASSACHUSETTS BONDING AND INSURANCE COMPANY OF BOSTON, MASS., SURETY—PARKER ELECTRIC COMPANY, CLEVELAND, OHIO, CONTRACTOR.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval a contract between the state of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works, and the Parker Electric Company, of Cleveland, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of Electrical Work for a project known as State Highway Garage Building, Division No. 12, Cleveland, Ohio, in accordance with Item No. 4, of the form of proposal dated October 8, 1936. Said contract calls for an expenditure of Four thousand nine hundred and thirty-five dollars (\$4,935.00).

You have submitted the certificate of the Directors of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have also submitted certificates of the Controlling Board showing that such board has released funds for this project in accordance with Section 8 of House Bill No. 531, of the Regular Session and Section 1 of Amended Senate Bill 401, of the First Special Session of the 91st General Assembly.

In addition, you have submitted a contract bond upon which the Massachusetts Bonding and Insurance Company of Boston, Massachusetts, appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law, and the contract duly awarded. Also, it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the Workmen's Compensation have been complied with.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon, and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.
