DISAPPROVAL—ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF UNITED
CASUALTY COMPANY.

DEAR SIR: I have examined the articles of incorporation of United Casualty Company which you have submitted to me for my approval. It is sought to incorporate this company as a mutual insurance company under the provisions of Section 9607-2, General Code.

The purposes of the corporation as set forth in the articles are the purposes contained in paragraph 1 of said section, except that in addition to said purposes, the articles contain the clause which is contained in paragraph 7 of said section. The statute however provides that "a mutual or a stock company may transact only the first kind of insurance or it may transact such as it may elect of the other kinds of insurance" set forth in said statute. Therefore, if this company desires to transact the kind of insurance set forth in the first paragraph of said statute, it can-
