APPROVAL, CONTRACT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND COMPLETION OF CONTRACT FOR ELECTRICAL WORK FOR A PROJECT KNOWN AS REMODELING FORMER STATE LIBRARY FOR OHIO SENATE, \$1,659.00, NATIONAL SURETY CORPORATION OF NEW YORK, SURETY-GUSTAV HIRSCH ORGANIZATION OF COLUMBUS, OHIO.

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works for the Ohio Senate, and Gustav Hirsch Organization of Columbus, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of Contract for Electrical Work for a project known as Remodeling former State Library for the Ohio Senate, Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with Item No. 3 of the form of proposal dated April 5, 1935. Said contract calls for an expenditure of one thousand six hundred and fifty-nine dollars (\$1,659.00).

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. It is noted that it is not necessary under section 2 of House Bill No. 145 of the second special session of the 90th General Assembly, appropriating the money for this contract, that the Controlling Board approve the release of the funds.

In addition, you have submitted a contract bond upon which the National Surety Corporation of New York, N. Y. appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given in the manner authorized by paragraph 3 of House Bill No. 145 of the second special session of the 90th General Assembly, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded.

Also, it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the workmen's compensation have been complied with.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon, and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.
