**Narrative:**

On Tuesday, December 20, 2022, the Marion County Sheriff's Office and Marion Police Department requested the assistance of the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) with the investigation of an Officer Involved Critical Incident which occurred in LaRue, Marion County, Ohio. During the investigation, Agents obtained records from the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) for [REDACTED] Special Agent Supervisor (SAS) Scott Stranahan reviewed those records and learned the following.

[REDACTED] attended the OPOTC basic training academy at the Marion Law Enforcement Academy from December 1, 2008 through June 19, 2009 (class # BAS08-106). Upon graduation, [REDACTED] received an appointment (commission) from the Wyandot County Sheriff's Office.
