TO SALE OF OHIO CANAL LANDS IN NEWARK, OHIO—

DEAR SIR: This is to acknowledge the receipt of your recent communication with which you submit for my examination and approval a transcript of your proceedings relating to the sale of a parcel of abandoned Ohio Canal lands in the city of Newark, Ohio, to one Daniel Z. Forry of said city for and in consideration of the payment by him of \$100.00, the appraised value of this parcel of land. The parcel of land here in question contains 7,320 square feet and is more particularly described by metes and bounds in the transcript.

This parcel of land is included in that section of the Ohio Canal which was abandoned for canal and hydraulic purposes by an act of the legislature in the year 1917, 107 O. L., 741, which in terms provided for the abandonment for the purposes above stated of that portion of the Ohio Canal commencing at the inner face of the westerly abutment of the aqueduct over Raccoon Creek in West Newark, Ohio, and extend-
