Dear Sir:

You have submitted a written petition signed by one hundred qualified electors of this state, proposing the adoption of a constitutional amendment to be known as Section 1h of Article II of the Constitution of the State of Ohio, together with a summary of the same. (See File—Attorney General of Ohio.)

In accordance with the provisions of Section 4785-175, General Code, it is the duty of the Attorney General to examine each constitutional

amendment so proposed and the summary thereof, and if he finds such summary to be a fair and truthful statement of the proposed amendment, he shall so certify. I therefore confine my consideration to the above statutory requirements, and hereby certify that such summary is a fair and truthful statement of the proposed constitutional provision. I do not, however, express any opinion as to the policy or wisdom of such proposed constitutional provision. The following certification is submitted for the uses provided by law :

“Pursuant to the duties imposed upon me under the provisions of Section 4785-175 of the General Code, I hereby certify that the attached summary is a fair and truthful statement of the proposed amendment, Section 1h of Article II of the Constitution of the State of Ohio.
