APPROVAL, CONTRACT BETWEEN THE STATE OF OHIO AND THE HATFIELD ELECTRIC COMPANY, CLEVELAND, OHIO, FOR ELECTRICAL WIRING OF NEW MALE INFIRMARY BUILDING, CLEVELAND STATE HOSPITAL AT A COST OF \$3,561.00—SURETY BOND EXECUTED BY THE INDEPENDENCE INDEMNITY COMPANY.

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Highways and Public Works and The Hatfield Electric Company, a corporation organized under the laws of Indiana with a branch office in the Keith Building, Cleveland, Ohio. This contract covers the electric wiring of the New Male Infirmary Building, Cleveland State Hospital and calls for an expenditure of \$3,561.00.

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. There has further been submitted a contract bond upon which The Independence Indemnity Company appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. Also it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the workmen's compensation have been complied with.

You have further submitted the certificate of the Secretary of State disclosing that the above named corporation is qualified to transact business in Ohio.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.
