4. One box containing firearm (Serial #ACJ267311) recovered from the scene (Matrix Item 008) (Crime Scene 1, Item 008).

A cartridge case(s) was entered and searched in the NIBIN database.

A triage of the submitted firearms evidence was performed. This process includes assessing cartridge case(s) and test fires to determine the best representative sample from those having similar firearm produced markings for NIBIN entry. This is not, nor should it be, interpreted as a comparative examination to the fired cartridge case(s) or as to determine how many firearms may have been responsible for firing the cartridge case(s).

A correlation review was performed by the ATF NIBIN National Correlation and Training Center (NNCTC) in Huntsville, Alabama. Their findings are referenced in the attached report.
