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APPROVAL—APPLICATION FOR REDUCTIONS IN CURRENT AND DELINQUENT RENTALS ON BUCKEYE LAKE LEASE—G. J. ABDALLA, LANCASTER, OHIO.

DEAR SIR: This is to acknowledge the receipt of your recent communication with which you submit for my examination and approval findings made by you effecting certain reductions in the current and delinquent rentals payable under a Buckeye Lake land lease executed by the state of Ohio through the Conservation Commissioner under date of July 23, 1931, and which is now owned and held by one G. J. Abdella of Lancaster, Ohio.

By the findings made by you, delinquent rentals due and payable under this lease have been reduced from the sum of \$126.00 to the sum of \$84.00, and the current rental under the lease for the year from November 1, 1936, to October 31, 1937, has been reduced from the sum of \$36.00 to the sum of \$24.00.

The reductions made by you in the rentals under the lease above referred to were so made pursuant to an application therefor filed by G. J. Abdalla under the authority of House Bill No. 467, 115 O. L., 512, in which reductions in these rentals were requested for the reasons therein stated. By your findings, you have found the facts stated in the application as reasons for the requested reductions to exist. I see no reason in point of law to question the conclusions reached by you in this matter. I am accordingly approving the findings made by you as is evidenced by my approval endorsed thereon and upon the duplicate and triplicate copies thereof, all of which, together with the application, are herewith returned.
