NARRATIVE

On the listed date and time officers responded to the place of occurrence in reference to an abandoned 911 call of service. Upon arrival, officers could hear an unknown male yelling for help. Officers then went to the second floor of the apartment complex and encountered OF#1 actively attempting to break out a north-facing window to gain entry to the apartment while yelling and armed with a knife. A use of force ensued. VI#1 was located inside suffering from multiple stab wounds. Both VI#1 and OF#1 were transported to Ohio Health Mansfield for treatment.

On the listed date and time this officer responded to the place of occurrence after officers advised they had "shots fired." Upon this officer's arrival at the scene, this officer ascended to the second floor and made contact with Officers Blair and Boggs. This officer asked both officers; "who shot." Both Officers Blair and Boggs advised this officer they had by raising their hands and/or nodding their heads in the affirmative. This officer then ordered Officers Boggs and Blair on station and from the scene.

This officer then entered apartment #A8 and observed Officer Hecht rendering aid to VI#1, while VI#1 was seated on a couch covered in blood and crying. This officer then observed OF#1 to the left side of the doorway suffering from multiple gunshots wounds to his upper torso, both arms, and right side of his face. This officer then ordered Officer Reedy to get the "life-saving kit" from a cruiser and this officer checked both sides of OF#1's neck for a pulse with negative results. OF#1 was not breathing at this time either. This officer was outside his scope of knowledge and could not assist OF#1. This officer then exited the apartment and advised Officers N. Gearhart, Hout, Leitz, and Reedy to tape off the crime scene and canvas citizens on the scene for witnesses.

This officer then re-entered the apartment with the "life-saving Kit" and rendered aid along with Officer Hecht to VI#1. VI#1 had a stab wound to his upper torso and the right side of his neck and head. MFD arrived and began life-saving measures on both VI#1 and OF#1. VI#1 was removed from the scene by MFD and transported to Ohio Health Mansfield. OF#1 was removed from the scene and transported by MFD to Ohio Health Mansfield. Lt. Garrick arrived on the scene and was advised that Officers Boggs and Blair were sent on station to await her arrival.

This officer then ordered the officers to identify evidence and secure areas of the scene with crime tape. Assistant Chief Bammann then arrived on the scene and was advised of events. Lieutenant Skropits then arrived on the scene and was advised of events. Chief Porch then arrived on the scene and was advised of events. Chief Porch advised this officer to save the cruiser videos (Cruisers S-3, 33). This officer then cleared the scene as Lieutenant Skropits was in charge of the scene and made contact with Lt. Garrick on station. This officer then saved In Car cruiser video for the event for cruisers S-3 and 33. The videos were labeled RTR.

This officer then completed the listed report. Officers Boggs and Blair were not listed as offenders in the listed report as VI#1 was already in the report as a victim of felonious assault. Based on video evidence charges for Burglary and or Aggravated Burglary for OF#1 are not listed due to his current medical condition. -END-

On the listed date and time, this officers was dispatched to the incident location in reference to an officer asking for additional units. Upon arrival, I observed Ofc. Blair #313 and Ofc. Boggs #293 standing outside of apartment A8 at 300 Wood St. I immediately grabbed a life saving kit from cruiser #38 and gave it Sgt. Webb. I then began putting up crime scene tape around the scene.

After applying the crime scene tape, I began making contact with possible witnesses. I made contact with Mr. and Mrs. Lute who advised they heard a loud argument coming from apartment A8. Mr. and Mrs. Lute further advised they then heard a window break which was follow by 4-5 gunshots.

I then made contact with Mr. Hout who lives at apartment A2. Mr. Hout advised he heard four gunshots in the area but did not see or hear anything further. I then applied more crime scene tape to the scene and stood by while BCI conducted their investigation.

This officer was dispatched to the incident location after officers on the scene requested another officer for backup. While en route to the call, officers on the scene advised that a male, later identified as James Haynes, had a knife. A short time later, officers advised that shots had been fired. Upon arrival, this officer observed the north side facing window of the apartment was shattered and a taser that appeared to had been deployed laying just northwest of the front door of the residence.

This officer entered the apartment, at which time this officer observed Mr. Haynes, laying on the ground just east of the front door, which he appeared to have multiple gunshot wounds. This officer checked Mr. Haynes for a pulse to render first aid, but this officer did not locate a pulse. This officer moved the table that was in the front room out of the way, so that there would be more room for MFD when they arrived to work on both individuals. This officer then assisted Officer Blair who was applying pressure to a stab wound that Jarvon Ginn had suffered to the chest area. This officer eventually replaced Officer Blair due to his involvement in the officer-involved shooting and that he had to leave the scene. This officer kept the pressure on Mr. Ginn`s wound until MFD arrived on the scene. Both Mr. Haynes and Mr. Ginn were transported to Ohio Health Mansfield for further treatment.

This officer was instructed by Sgt. Webb to began to canvas the area to look for witnesses. This officer made contact with WI#1, a resident of the incident location. WI#1 stated that Mr. Haynes and Mr. Ginn were in an argument. WI#1 believed that Mr. Haynes and Mr. Ginn were in a relationship. WI#1 further stated that Mr. Haynes made the comments, "I'm going to cut his face" and "I'm going to die tonight." WI#1 advised that he left the apartment to speak with a C & D Taxi Driver, but could hear an argument still inside. WI#1 further advised that Mr. Haynes exited that apartment, at which time Mr. Ginn shut the door to the residence. WI#1 stated that officers arrived, at which time Mr. Haynes was armed with a Knife. WI#1 further stated that officers told Mr. Haynes to drop the knife multiple times, but Mr. Haynes would not comply with the officer`s orders. WI#1 advised that Mr. Haynes began to walk toward officers, at which time he began to use his elbow in an attempt to break the window. WI#1 further advised that Mr. Haynes was not the same person that he was when he entered the apartment. WI#1 stated that an officer tased Mr. Haynes, then a short time later officers fired their weapons toward Mr. Haynes.

This officer transported WI#1 to the Mansfield Police Department so that he could be interviewed. This officer returned to the incident location and continued to preserve the scene until BCI arrived. BCI arrived and took control of the scene. Once BCI was finished, this officer assisted other officers in removing the crime scene tape. This officer had no further involvement.

Upon officer arrival, this officer began assisting other officers in taping off the scene with crime scene tape. This officer was then ordered to secure the scene and not allow anyone near the scene. This officer was then contacted by WI#3 who advised that he lives in apartment A7. WI#3 then stated that he heard two male voices arguing in apartment A8. WI#3 went on to state that while the two males were arguing he heard "four to five pops almost like firecrackers." WI#3 advised that shortly after he heard the "pops" he then heard two more voices yelling Police. WI#3 advised that after he heard the police he heard some sort of struggle then gunshots. WI#3 stated when he heard the gunshots he "jumped to the floor." WI#3 then stated to this officer that was all he heard during the incident. This officer then continued to secure the scene until BCI was done with their investigation. This is the conclusion of this officer`s involvement.

I responded to the listed location at the request of Sgt. Webb. Upon arrival Sgt. Webb advised of a male stabbing victim, later identified as a Jaron Ginn who had already been transported to Ohio Health by MFD for treatment and another male victim who was shot numerous times, later identified as a James Haynes. James was also already transported to Ohio Health for treatment by MFD. The location of the scene including the upstairs catwalk area in front of apartment A8 as well as inside of A8. I was advised that both Jaron Ginn and James Haynes arrived in a taxi together and that the taxi driver, Laconya Williams was also a witness. I requested patrol to transport Ms. Williams on station to be interviewed. I requested Sgt. Webb to secure the scene as a search warrant was needed. I then secured from the scene and went to Ohio Health to see the conditions of James Haynes and Jaron Ginn.

While enroute to Ohio Health I contacted Lt. Skropits who advised he was on his way in with Det. Schacherer to assist. Upon arriving at Ohio Health I was advised that Jaron Ginn was in emergency room #4 and James Haynes was in room # 8. I was advised that Jaron had suffered at least 11 possible stab wounds and that James Haynes had been suffered at least 5 shots. Jaron Ginn was taken to surgery and James was taken for a scan. I contacted Lt. Skropits and provided him an update. Lt. Skropits advised me to stay at the hospital until Lab Tech Cindy Reed arrives to collect the clothing/property of both Jaron Ginn and James Haynes. Lab Tech Cindy Reed arrived and collected the clothing and property.

I briefly spoke to family members of James Haynes in the waiting room. Sandra Bently, ps 419-544-2893 and a Vowana Butler, ps 440-539-8902. They provided me James Haynes date of birth of 12/1/81. I then advised the hospital chaplin that they would like to hear an update of James.

I then arrived on station and waited for BCI. Upon arrival on station I was advised the Ms. Williams and another witness, John Black was waiting on station to be interviewed. BCI agent arrived on station and Ms. Laconya Williams was then interviewed by the agent as I sat in on the interview. The interview was recorded and downloaded onto a disc. Laconya advised she picked up 2 males at 225 S. Mulberry Street and was advised they were going to 248 Wood Street. On 07-29-21 I was contacted by Lt Skropits via phone and asked to respond to station in reference to this incident. I then reported on station at which time I was asked by Lt Skropits to complete a search warrant for the incident location (300 Wood St Apt #A8). The search warrant was then completed and submitted to the Honorable Judge Ault for his approval.

I then responded to the scene and made contact with Lt Skropits with a copy of the signed search warrant. Ohio BCI then began processing the scene for evidence. Upon their (Ohio BCI) completion they provided me a copy of evidence that had been collected and I then attached that listed to GO#21-18369 which I completed after securing from the scene.

On this date I came on station and returned the search warrant, getting it signed by Magistrate M. Lore` Whitney, before filing it with the Clerk Of Courts. I then put together the case jacket on this case.

Lt Skropits, Cory Momchilov and myself went to Ohio Health Mansfield and made contact with Jaron V. Ginn. Jaron was then asked to give a recorded statement as to this event as well as a Buccal Swab, which he agreed to do both. Jaron advised that he had gone to the incident location with James Haynes via a cab, but neither had any cash on them. Jaron states that they both then went up to "Boons" apartment in an attempt to get some cash to pay for the cab. Jaron stated that once "Boon" opened the door, he invited the two inside the apartment. Jaron states that "Boon" did not have any cash and had at some point gone down to talk with the cab driver about the issue. Jaron stated that after "Boon" had left the apartment James came over to him and began saying he thought Jaron was a cop. Jaron stated that James then pulled out a knife that he had on him and at some point began stabbing him. Jaron stated that he then began to fight with James and scream for help. Jaron stated that James then walked out the front door and he (Jaron) went over closed the door and locked it. Jaron stated that he then heard voices say "Mansfield Police" and "put your hands up". Jaron stated that he then heard James attempting to break out a window and then a couple gunshots.

I then collected a Buccal Swab from Jaron and took two pictures (FP# 11777D...FR#172-173) of his injuries. Jaron did have numerous other stab wounds on his back that were not able to be photographed at this time.
