APPROVAL, CONTRACT BETWEEN THE STATE OF OHIO AND BELL LAUTZENHEISER, WOOSTER, OHIO, FOR THE HEATING CONTRACT FOR POULTRY STORAGE AND SERVICE BUILDING, OHIO AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION, WOOSTER, OHIO, AT AN EXPENDITURE OF \$1,771.00—SURETY BOND EXECUTED BY THE UNITED STATES FIDELITY AND GUARANTY COMPANY.

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works, for the Board of Control of the Ohio Agricultural Experiment Station at Wooster, Ohio, and Bell and Lautzenheiser, of Wooster, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of Heating Contract as set forth in Item 3 of proposal of June 19th for construction of Poultry Storage and Service Building, Brooder House and Laying House at Ohio Agricultural Experiment Station, Wooster, Ohio, and calls for an expenditure of one thousand seven hundred seventy-one and no/100ths (\$1,771.00) dollars.

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. No Industrial Certificate has been furnished, however, as required by Section 2319, General Code, and until such certificate is furnished I shall be unable to approve the contract.
