APPROVAL—CERTIFICATION OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT RELATIVE TO "LOTTERIES" AND A SUMMARY OF THE SAME UNDER SECTION 4785-175, GENERAL CODE.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my examination a written petition signed by one hundred qualified electors of this state, containing a proposed constitutional amendment and a summary of the same under Section 4785-175, General Code.

It is proposed to amend Section 6 of Article XV of the Constitution, to read as follows:

"Lotteries and the sale of lottery tickets shall be prohibited unless such lottery is operated by the state."

The summary of this amendment reads as follows:

"The constitutional amendment proposed by this petition amends Section 6 to Article XV of the Constitution of Ohio to permit the State of Ohio to operate a lottery."

I am of the opinion that the foregoing is a fair and truthful statement of the proposed constitutional amendment and accordingly submit for uses provided by law the following certification:
