DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works for the House of Representatives, State House, Columbus, Ohio, and The Huffman-Wolfe Company of Columbus, Ohio. Also it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the workmen's compensation have been complied with.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.
