APPROVAL, CONTRACT BETWEEN STATE OF OHIO AND C. A. HARNER, OF XENIA, OHIO, FOR COMPLETION OF CONTRACT FOR ELECTRICAL WORK IN BUILDING FOR OHIO SOLDIERS' AND SAILORS' ORPHANS' HOME, XENIA, OHIO, AT AN EXPENDITURE OF \$3,095.00—SURETY BOND EXECUTED BY GLENS FALLS INDEMNITY COMPANY OF GLENS FALLS, NEW YORK.

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works, for the Ohio Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphans' Home, Xenia, Ohio, and C. A. Harner, of Xenia, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of contract for electrical work to be installed in a building known as the Vocational Training School Building, for the Ohio Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphans' Home, Xenia, Ohio, as set forth in Item No. 2 of the Form of Proposal submitted April 18, 1930. Said contract calls for an expenditure of three thousand and ninety-five dollars (\$3,095.00).

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have also submitted evidence that the consent of the Controlling Board to the release of funds has been obtained in accordance with Section 11 of House Bill No. 516 of the 88th General Assembly. In addition, you have submitted a contract bond upon which the Glens Falls Indemnity Company of Glens Falls, New York, appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. Also it appears that the law relating to the status of surety companies has been complied with. It is to be noted that an affidavit has been submitted by the contractor showing that he employs less than three men in Ohio and therefore an industrial certificate need not be obtained.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.
