APPROVAL, CONTRACT BETWEEN THE STATE OF OHIO AND HARSH, DAVIES AND RUBRECHT, INC., COLUMBUS, OHIO, FOR ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES FOR REMODELING OF ADMINISTRATION BUILDING AT OHIO SOLDIERS' AND SAILORS' ORPHANS' HOME, XENIA, OHIO, AT AN EXPENDITURE OF \$600.00.

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my examination and opinion, a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by and through the Department of Public Works, for and on behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Ohio Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphans' Home, Xenia, Ohio, and Harsh, Davies and Rubrecht, Inc., Columbus, Ohio, for architectural services in connection with the remodeling of the present administration building at said home, and providing for compensation to the architects in an amount equal to 5½% of the amount paid out by the State of Ohio under and on account of contracts entered into by the state for the construction of said improvement.

You have also submitted evidence showing that the emergency board has duly released the sum of \$600.00 for architect's fees.

You have further submitted encumbrance estimate No. 1, in the estimated amount of five hundred and fifty dollars (\$550.00) and bearing the certificate of the Director of Finance, to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated, sufficient to pay the same as required by Section 2288-2, General Code.

Evidence is enclosed showing that the board of trustees of the Ohio Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphans' Home has requested that this contract be entered into.

Finding said contract in proper legal form, I have endorsed my approval thereon and hereby return the same to you, together with all other papers submitted in this connection.
