- Phone number- Residential and familial information of designated public service workers pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(p) and R.C. 149.43(A)(7)-(8)
- Address-Residential and familial information of designated public service workers pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(p) and R.C. 149.43(A)(7)-(8)
- Employee ID numbers- R.C. 149.433 (2) and (3). Employee ID numbers are not public record, pursuant to R.C. 149.433 (2) and (3).
- LE firearm and taser Serial Number- Law enforcement firearm serial number and taser serial number, pursuant to R.C. 149.433
- All officers work shifts- R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(uu), “Records of the past, current, and future work schedule of a designated public service worker. As used in division (A)(1)(tt) of this section, ‘work schedule’ does not include the docket of cases of a court, judge, or magistrate.
- SSN- R.C.149.43(A)(1)(dd) 149.45(A)(1)(a)- *State ex rel. Office of Montgomery County Pub. Defender v. Siroki*, 108 Ohio St.3d 207, 842 N.E.2d 508, 2006-Ohio-662, ¶ 18; R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(dd); and R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(a).
- Driver’s license number-R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(C)18 U.S.C. § 2741, Driver’s license numbers are considered personal information, exempt from disclosure, pursuant to R.C. 149.45(A)(1)(c), and are further protected from disclosure by the Driver’s Privacy Protection Act of 1994. 18 U.S.C. § 2741.
- OHLEG photos, documents and audits- Information, data, and statistics obtained from the Ohio Law Enforcement Gateway (OHLEG) database, pursuant to R.C.109.57(D)(1)(b)
- CCH- Information from the Computerized Criminal History (CCH) National Crime Information Center (NCIC) systems, pursuant to R.C. 109.57 and O.A.C. 4501:2-10-06(C)
- LEADS documents - Law Enforcement Agencies Database Systems (LEADS) documents withheld - Ohio Administrative Code 4501:2-10-06(c).
- Autopsy photos & reports- Autopsy photographs and reports, redacted pursuant to R.C. 313.10(D) Information obtained from medical records redacted - R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(a).
- EMS Run Sheet- When a run sheet created and maintained by a county emergency medical services (EMS) organization documents treatment of a living patient, the EMS organization may redact information that pertains to the patient’s medical history, diagnosis, prognosis, or medical condition R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(a), and physician-patient privilege R.C.149.43(A)(1)(v), R.C. 2317.02(B), *State ex rel. Nix v. Cleveland*, 83 Ohio St.3d 379 (1998).
- Telephone number of witnesses- Telephone numbers of victims or witnesses to a crime that are listed on a law enforcement record or report, pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(mm)
- Medical Records- 149.43(A)(1)(a). Information obtained from medical records redacted. R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(a).
- Toxicology reports- Information obtained from medical records redacted - R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(a).
- PII (confidential personal information)- Personal information as defined by Ohio Revised Code Chapter 1347 is not a public record pursuant to R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(v) and Federal Privacy Act of 1974.

- Juvenile Court Records – redacted as provided in Juv R.37(B) and probation records R.C.2151.14(B).
- Financial Account Numbers redacted under R.C. 149.43(A)(1)(dd); 149.45(A)(1)(d).
- Security Records of detention facility are redacted pursuant to R.C. 143.433.
- Ohio R.C.149.43 (A)(1)(ii) Any depiction by photograph, film, videotape, or printed or digital image under either of the following circumstances: (i) The depiction is that of a victim of an offense the release of which would be, to a reasonable person of ordinary sensibilities, an offensive and objectionable intrusion into the victim's expectation of bodily privacy and integrity.
