Re: Bonds of Village of Shelby, Richland County, \$6,350.00.

Industrial Commission of Ohio, Columbus, Ohio.

Gentlemen: Upon examination of the transcript for the above bond issue I find that notice of the assessment was published for three consecutive weeks, commencing on November 20, 1926. The assessing ordinance was passed December 6, 1926, and hence the full time required by the statute did not elapse.

Section 3895 of the General Code provides as follows:

"Before adopting an assessment made as provided in this chapter, the council shall publish notice for three weeks consecutively, in a newspaper of general circulation in the corporation, that such assessment has been made, and that it is on file in the office of the clerk for the inspection and examination of persons interested therein."

It will therefore be observed that the publication in this instance was not in accordance with the provisions of this section which provides that at least twenty-one days must elapse from the date of the first publication to the date of the passage of the ordinance levying the assessment. Here the first publication was made on November 20th and action thereon could not have been legally taken until after the lapse of twenty-one days from that date.

The property owners have not been given the time required by the above statute under the ruling in the case of the village of Maple Heights vs. Holtz, 100 O. S., 264.

I am therefore compelled to advise that the assessments have not been made legally, and for that reason, you are advised not to accept the bonds issued in anticipation of the collection thereof.
