Narrative:

On Monday, June 10, 2024, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Eric Lehnhart (SA Lehnhart) received John Anthony Perry's (Perry) medical records from Saybrook Township Fire Department (SFD). The records were obtained pursuant to a law enforcement investigatory request. SA Lehnhart reviewed the medical records and noted the following:

Perry's medical records consisted of two (2) pages.

The Saybrook Fire Department was called by the Ashtabula County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) to stage near Tryon Road for a subject (Perry) who was barricaded in his home. After an extended standoff, Perry was shot during gun fire exchanged with the Lake County Multi-Jurisdictional SWAT Team. A paramedic and basic EMT arrived on scene to find Perry with gunshot wounds (GSW) to his head and chest.

Paramedics noted that Perry's brain matter was observed on the floor near his body. Perry was absent a carotid pulse. Additionally, no breathing was observed. Perry was pronounced deceased via a cellular telephone call between a SWAT Tactical Emergency Medical Services member and Dr. J. Carter.
