APPROVAL, SYNOPSIS TO BE EMPOWERED IN AN INITIATIVE PETITION. PROPOSED AMENDMENT UNDER SEC. 2 OF ARTICLE XII OF THE SUPPLEMENT DESIGNATED AS SECTION 2-A OF ARTICLE XII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF OHIO.

Gentlemen:—You have submitted to me under date of March 10th, 1925, for my certificate under Section 5175-29e of the General Code, a synopsis to be empowered in an initiative petition, said synopsis being in the words and figures as follows:

SYNOPSIS.

The purpose of this proposed amendment is to alter and supplement Section 2 of Article XII of the Ohio Constitution to add to such Article XII a new provision to be designated as Section 2A of such Article XII, and to so provide:

FIRST—That motor vehicles, which term shall include only self-propelled vehicles designed and intended for use in transportation upon the public highways, and otherwise than upon rails, of persons or property, or both, shall be exempt from taxation.

SECOND—That no excise or other tax shall be levied upon the use or sale of such motor vehicles or any accessories thereto, except upon a single sale or use of fuel therefor, which tax shall in no event exceed two cents per gallon upon such sale or use of such fuel, but not upon both sale and use.

THIRD—That any fee for registration of such motor vehicles shall be limited to one dollar for each such motor vehicle.

FOURTH—That all money collected by any tax or fee under provision of this amendment shall be used only for the purpose of construction, maintenance, and improvement of the highway system of the State.
