Narrative:

On Saturday, July 8, 2023, the Franklin County Sheriff's Office (FCSO) and the Columbus Division of Police (CPD) requested the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) to investigate the facts and circumstances surrounding a shooting incident between Antwan M. Lindsey (Lindsey) and law enforcement officers from both agencies. The incident occurred at an apartment building located at 3110 E. Livingston Avenue, Columbus, Ohio (Franklin County). Lindsey was transported by ambulance to Grant Medical Center, where he was pronounced deceased.

On Sunday, July 9, 2023 at approximately 0029 hours, BCI Special Agent Jon Scale (SA Scale) interviewed FCSO Deputy Jacob Anderson (Deputy Anderson), badge #1241. The interview took place at CPD substation 11/12 located at 950 E. Main Street, Columbus, OH. The interview was audio recorded and a copy is attached to this report, and a copy was electronically uploaded to the case file.

Deputy Anderson has been a FCSO deputy for the past nine (9) years. His typical shifts are 3:00 P.M. through 11:00 P.M., with Wednesdays and Thursdays off. He was wearing his standard FCSO uniform and body worn camera (BWC). He said their BWC footage automatically uploads to their servers. He has not viewed the footage from his BWC of the incident. Deputy Anderson was in FCSO marked cruiser #21, and was a single unit cruiser. He stated that cruiser #21 does have a front facing dash cam.

Deputy Anderson explained that he was located in the Blacklick area near Taylor Road when he heard FCSO [REDACTED] call out over the radio that there were shots fired. He said within a minute he heard [REDACTED] air that he was taking fire. Deputy Anderson then headed towards 3110 E. Livingston Avenue.

Deputy Anderson said he heard over the radio that the suspect was down and then that the suspect went back inside the building. Deputy Anderson arrived on scene and parked his cruiser near East Livingston and James Road. Deputy Anderson said he then heard several gunshots. He did not see who was firing the shots, and said that he [Deputy Anderson] never discharged his weapon. He approached the building on foot and posted up on the west side of the building.

Deputy Anderson was then told they needed him to go to the rear of the building to help clear residents from the apartment building. He went to the lower level and started knocking on doors trying to get residents out of the building. While on the lower level he saw the suspect on the ground and medics working on him. He was located on the lower level near the south side entrance. Deputy Anderson said he never got close to the subject on the ground that the medics were working on, and could not even describe the subject. He said medics removed the subject out the south door facing East Livingston Avenue.

Deputy Anderson said that when he arrived it was pretty much after the incident. He never saw the subject or any officers fire their weapons.

This interview concluded at approximately 0040 hours.
