APPROVAL, GRANT OF EASEMENT BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE WORTHINGTON VILLAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT, SHARON TOWNSHIP, FRANKLIN COUNTY, OHIO.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my examination and approval a certain grant of easement, No. 619, executed to the State of Ohio by the Board of Education of the Worthington Village School District, Franklin County, Ohio, conveying to the State of Ohio, for the purposes therein stated, a certain tract of land in Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio.
