APPROVAL, LEASE TO RESERVOIR LAND AT FORT LORAMIE, OHIO—JULIUS J. PAUWELL.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, June 12, 1933.

Hon. Earl H. Hanefeld, Director, Department of Agriculture, Columbus, Ohio.

Dear Sir:—Under date of June 9, 1933, the Chief of the Bureau of Inland Lakes and Parks submitted for my examination and approval a certain reservoir land lease in triplicate which has been executed by the Conservation Commissioner pursuant to the directions of a resolution heretofore adopted by the Conservation Council under the general authority conferred upon such Conservation Council by the provisions of Section 472-1, General Code. The lease here in question is executed to one, Julius J. Pauwell of Fort Loramie, Ohio; and this lease, for a term of fifteen (15) years, permits the lessee named to use for boathouse, docklanding and business purposes, a portion of the west bank of Lake Loramie which is described as follows:

"The inner slope and water front of the west bank of Lake Loramie, beginning at a point four hundred (400) feet northerly from the center of the feeder bulkhead; said point being the northerly line of the Thomas Johnson and August Schunk lease, and running thence northerly one hundred (100) feet to a point that is five hundred (500) feet northerly, as measured along the center of the bank from the center line of the above mentioned bulkhead."

From examination of this lease I find that the same has been properly executed by the Conservation Commissioner acting under authority of the resolution of the Conservation Council above referred to, and by the lessee named in this lease. I further find upon examination of the provisions of this lease and of the conditions and restrictions therein contained, that the same are in conformity with statutory enactments relating to leases of this kind.

I am accordingly approving this lease as to legality and form as is evidenced by my approval endorsed upon the lease and upon the duplicate and triplicate copies thereof, all of which are herewith returned.
