Narrative:

On Friday, November 14, 2025, at approximately 2153 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) James Gore and Amanda North (SA Gore and SA North) interviewed Brown County Sheriff's Office (BCSO) Lieutenant Kyle Singleton (Lt. Singleton) at the scene of an officer-involved shooting in Adams County. The incident occurred earlier on the same date at 4175 Brush Creek Road in Manchester. Lt. Singleton was identified as a witness to the incident, and the purpose of the interview was to obtain his account of the events.

Lt. Singleton advised that he is in the patrol division at BCSO, and his call sign is 8B-87. He said he was dispatched to assist Adams County on a vehicle pursuit. Lt. Singleton said he was cancelled for the pursuit, then later dispatched again to assist Adams County for a drone deployment. He said it was for a barricaded suspect inside of a home. Lt. Singleton said he returned to the BCSO for fuel, then he responded directly to the scene on Brush Creek Road in Manchester.

Lt. Singleton reported that once he arrived, he set up on a gravel area at the bottom of a hill to deploy his drone. He said he then moved closer to the residential structure, where the driveway split, so that he could show and share the footage from the drone to other units in the area.

Lt. Singleton said he initially flew the drone over the south end of the structure, because there was no way to safely get manpower to that area. He said he was later told to fly over the north side of the structure, because the suspect appeared on the balcony.

Lt. Singleton stated that he did see the suspect on the balcony, but he had to land the drone to swap out its battery. He said he did not have the drone in the air when the gunfire was exchanged. Lt. Singleton explained that once the drone was back up, he observed the suspect laying on his back with what appeared to be a rifle at his feet. He

said he could not see his face, but he recalled that he was wearing a camouflage vest of some sort, and possibly blue jeans. Lt. Singleton said the weapon appeared to be a bolt-action hunting rifle.

Lt. Singleton said from his vantage point, he did not see who fired weapons. He recalled hearing a single gunshot, which was followed by many more. He could not estimate how many rounds were fired in total.




Figure 1: Reference map

Lt. Singleton said his drone model was a DJI Matrice 30T. He said it was not recording video, but he did take a few snapshots of the scene after the shooting. Lt. Singleton said after the incident, he turned the drone's media card over to Sergeant Randy Walters, of the Adams County Sheriff's Office.

The interview concluded at approximately 2200 hours. An audio copy of the interview is available for review as an attachment to this report.
