Narrative:

Special Agent (SA) Tiffany Najmulski (Najmulski) requested and received the Perrysburg Township radio traffic for the Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred on May 23, 2024. As a result of that request, SA Najmulski reviewed the audio radio traffic and Dispatch logs and noted the items of interest to this investigation. It should be noted that the audio recording file provided to SA Najmulski is one complete audio file, with no times designated for each individual radio transmission.

Radio Traffic Recording: All times are in relation to the player

0:00/14:00 minutes-Dispatch told units responding she had a male subject with a weapon in his hand, who thought someone was trying to kill him. Location was Blue Jacket and Tracy Road, Lot 327.

01:11/12:54 minutes-A unit responding asked if the caller was the subject and if dispatch knew what kind of weapon. (When the officer keyed his mic, lights and sirens could be heard). Dispatch responded saying she kept asking questions and was not getting answers. The dispatcher said it sounded like he was having a mental breakdown and believed he was the one that had the weapon.

01:54/12:08 minutes-Dispatch went on to say the subject seemed to be in distress and kept saying "Let me go". Dispatch was not sure if there was anyone else there. Dispatch went on to say the subject kept yelling and it was hard to hear. Dispatch then stated she did not know for sure if she heard a gunshot.

03:20/10:45 minutes-Dispatch said she could hear the subject screaming but it was "dead air" most of the time. A responding officer said they were at "327" searching.

03:45/10:16 minutes-Dispatch conducted a checkup. Units said they were ok but needed additional units. The officer went on to say they had a subject down in the ditch off Tracy

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Road and they needed traffic blocked off north and south bound. One of the officers stated the subject was shooting from the ditch.

05:05/08:56 minutes-Dispatch said Perrysburg City and Lake Township were in route.

06:35/07:29 minutes-One of the officers radioed, "Shots fired" and dispatch repeated it. The officer then said to put medics on standby.

06:57/07:05 minutes-Radio put medics on standby at the Circle K gas station. An officer asked for traffic to be stopped northbound on Tracy Road. An officer reiterated, to outside departments responding, where traffic needed to be stopped.

09:15/04:42 minutes-Dispatch relayed to officers that the person living in unit 330 had a knock on his door by a subject in a white t-shirt who then took off in an unknown direction.

09:32/04:31 minutes-One of the officers radioed they had an unknown location on the subject, shots fired and did not know which way he went.

10:51/03:06 minutes-Dispatch relayed that there was an unknown male walking in the middle of "Jones" who was walking around and appeared "intoxicated".

11:35/02:26 minutes-One of the officers said he believed they had the subject there, just north of the park.

12:19/01:45 minutes-Dispatch asked officers for a checkup and an officer said to standby. An officer then stated he believed they had a subject down and for a medic to make the determination.

13:18/00:46 minutes-Dispatch relayed to medics to respond to Tracy Road, and it is believed the subject was deceased.

The audio stopped at this point. The audio recording was 14 minutes and 5 seconds long and is attached to this report and to the case file.

Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) Records:

SA Najmulski received dispatch CAD screens for the City of Perrysburg, Perrysburg Township Police Department and Wood County dispatch. During the review of records SA Najmulski noted the following as being of interest.

The Wood County communications log shows that at approximately 22:50 hours on May 23, 2024, a call came in of a subject with "weapon in hand" who was saying his family was following him and trying to kill him. The caller was calling from phone number 419-764-9739. The call was transferred to Perrysburg Township Police Department.

The Perrysburg Township log indicated, Scott Mendoza, called into the department saying he knew Beau Purtee and they all had been to a funeral earlier. They came back to the deceased's residence which was located at the Friendly Village Mobile home park. Purtee brandished a weapon at the residence.

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SA Najmulski also received reports from Rossford Police, the crime scene log, and the Use of Force Policy which have been attached to this investigative report for further review.



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



On 05-23-2024 at approximately 2258 hours, I heard radio traffic from Perrysburg Township PD regarding a call in Friendly Village Trailer Park off of Tracy Road. The call details were that a male subject had called in advising that someone was trying to kill him and that he was currently armed. I continued to monitor their radio traffic and began to respond towards the location. Perrysburg Township dispatch relayed that the male subject sounded as if he was having a mental breakdown and that he was not responding to any of their questions. Perrysburg Township dispatch also advised that they had heard something that sounded like a gunshot. Soon after I heard township units advise that they were at the location searching the area. At approximately 2300 hours, I heard a township unit advise shots fired over the air and request additional units to block traffic on Tracy Road. I relayed to Rossford units that township had shots fired, and to respond to the location.

I proceeded to the location and arrived on Tracy Road just north of Latcha Road. I blocked northbound traffic on the roadway and positioned my patrol vehicle on the Ohio Turnpike overpass in an overwatch position to watch the field south of Friendly Village. At this time, Perrysburg Township officers had advised that the suspect was shooting from the ditch on Tracy Road and they were unaware of his current location. I remained on the perimeter overwatch position with Ofc. Farabee and officers from Perrysburg City for approximately five minutes until I heard Perrysburg Township officers advise that they had located the suspect in a ditch just north of the park on Tracy Road. At this time, I collapsed the perimeter and proceeded to the Township officer's location to assist further.

I arrived at the scene location at approximately 2315 hours and positioned my patrol vehicle in the roadway next to a Township patrol car. I approached the Township officers, who were located north of the park on the west side of the roadway. I observed the male suspect at the bottom of the ditch partially covered by water. The suspect appeared to be deceased. I made contact with Sergeant Wheatley, who was standing next to the suspect and asked how I could be of assistance. Sgt. Wheatly advised that he was unable to locate a pulse on the suspect, and that we may need to move him to begin rendering aid. I retrieved a medical kit from my patrol vehicle and returned to the suspect location. At that time, I saw that EMS was arriving on scene and would be able to conduct an assessment of the suspect.

I then asked who was involved in the shooting incident. Sgt. Wheatley indicated that he was the only one involved. I then separated Sgt. Wheatley from the scene location and advised him to follow me to my patrol vehicle. Sgt. Wheatley was seated in the front seat of my patrol vehicle and I advised him that his involvement with the incident was over, and that he should contact a representative from OPBA for further guidance.

Knowing at that time that EMS was on location with the suspect and that Sgt. Wheatley had been separated from the incident, I shifted my focus to securing the scene. Ofc. Gearig from Perrysburg Township was able to inform me of the approximate location of where the incident began. I directed officers from Perrysburg City to setup crime scene tape on the southern end of the scene, and directed Ofc. Farabee to setup crime scene tape on the northern end of the scene. Once the scene was secure, I remained until additional assets from Perrysburg Township PD arrived on scene.

Once additional assets arrived, Detective Lieutenant Moskowitz informed me that dispatch had received a call from family members of the suspect, and that they were located at the Wendy's restaurant on Buck Road. Detective Lieutenant Moskowitz requested that I go to that location and gather information from the family members so they could get in contact with them at a later time. Detective Lieutenant Moskowitz requested that I limit the amount of information that I provide to the family until they were able to speak with them.

At approximately 0010 hours I arrived at the Wendy's restaurant and made contact with a group of five individuals

in the parking lot. The group informed me that they had been with the suspect in Friendly Village at lot number 293 a short time prior to the incident. I identified the five individuals (see listed witnesses) and gathered contact information for each of them. One of the individuals was identified as SCOTT MENDOZA, and he began to explain the events that had occurred prior to police being called to the location. According to SCOTT, the group had attended a funeral for a male named Arthur Purtee earlier in the evening at approximately 1900 hours. SCOTT explained that the suspect from the Perrysburg Township incident was BEAU PURTEE, that he was a cousin of Arthur Purtee, and that he had also attended the funeral. SCOTT then stated that the group left the funeral home and arrived at Friendly Village around 2130 hours. SCOTT told me that once they arrived at the location that BEAU began acting "belligerent" and "was very very intoxicated". SCOTT stated that he exited the trailer to call a family member of BEAU'S to inform him of his behavior. AMANDA MENDOZA then began to explain BEAU'S actions inside the trailer. According to AMANDA, BEAU continued to act belligerent and then removed a firearm that he had tucked in the front of his waistband. BEAU manipulated the firearm, removing the magazine to show AMANDA and DANNY that it was loaded to capacity. AMANDA stated that BEAU then began making "sexual innuendos" and made statements about "being the bad guy". AMANDA stated that she then left the location because of BEAU'S behavior. SCOTT then continued to explain his involvement and told me that BEAU then moved outside the trailer, became combative, began backing away from them, and started to make statements like "don't come any closer". SCOTT then shifted to telling me that as he was leaving the area he heard what he described as "fireworks or gunshots" several times and in different locations.

I concluded my contact with the group by providing business cards and informing them that Perrysburg Township detectives would likely be in contact with them soon.

Perrysburg Township dispatch was contacted and provided with identities and phone numbers for the witnesses.

BWC video of this incident was recorded.

On 05-23-2024 at approximately 2258 hours, I heard radio traffic from Perrysburg Township PD regarding a call in Friendly Village Trailer Park off of Tracy Road. The call details were that a male subject had called in advising that someone was trying to kill him and that he was currently armed. I continued to monitor their radio traffic and began to respond towards the location. Perrysburg Township dispatch relayed that the male subject sounded as if he was having a mental breakdown and that he was not responding to any of their questions. Perrysburg Township dispatch also advised that they had heard something that sounded like a gunshot. Soon after I heard township units advise that they were at the location searching the area. At approximately 2300 hours, I heard a township unit advise shots fired over the air and request additional units to block traffic on Tracy Road. I relayed to Rossford units that township had shots fired, and to respond to the location.

I proceeded to the location and arrived on Tracy Road just north of Latcha Road. I blocked northbound traffic on the roadway and positioned my patrol vehicle on the Ohio Turnpike overpass in an overwatch position to watch the field south of Friendly Village. At this time, Perrysburg Township officers had advised that the suspect was shooting from the ditch on Tracy Road and they were unaware of his current location. I remained on the perimeter overwatch position with Ofc. Farabee and officers from Perrysburg City for approximately five minutes until I heard Perrysburg Township officers advise that they had located the suspect in a ditch just north of the park on Tracy Road. At this time, I collapsed the perimeter and proceeded to the Township officer's location to assist further.

I arrived at the scene location at approximately 2315 hours and positioned my patrol vehicle in the roadway next to a Township patrol car. I approached the Township officers, who were located north of the park on the west side of the roadway. I observed the male suspect at the bottom of the ditch partially covered by water. The suspect appeared to be deceased. I made contact with Sergeant Wheatley, who was standing next to the suspect and asked how I could be of assistance. Sgt. Wheatly advised that he was unable to locate a pulse on the suspect, and that we may need to move him to begin rendering aid. I retrieved a medical kit from my patrol vehicle and returned to the suspect location. At that time, I saw that EMS was arriving on scene and would be able to conduct an assessment of the suspect.

I then asked who was involved in the shooting incident. Sgt. Wheatley indicated that he was the only one involved. I then separated Sgt. Wheatley from the scene location and advised him to follow me to my patrol vehicle. Sgt. Wheatley was seated in the front seat of my patrol vehicle and I advised him that his involvement with the incident was over, and that he should contact a representative from OPBA for further guidance.

Knowing at that time that EMS was on location with the suspect and that Sgt. Wheatley had been separated from the incident, I shifted my focus to securing the scene. Ofc. Gearig from Perrysburg Township was able to inform me of the approximate location of where the incident began. I directed officers from Perrysburg City to setup crime scene tape on the southern end of the scene, and directed Ofc. Farabee to setup crime scene tape on the northern end of the scene. Once the scene was secure, I remained until additional assets from Perrysburg Township PD arrived on scene.

Once additional assets arrived, Detective Lieutenant Moskowitz informed me that dispatch had received a call from family members of the suspect, and that they were located at the Wendy's restaurant on Buck Road. Detective Lieutenant Moskowitz requested that I go to that location and gather information from the family members so they could get in contact with them at a later time. Detective Lieutenant Moskowitz requested that I limit the amount of information that I provide to the family until they were able to speak with them.

At approximately 0010 hours I arrived at the Wendy's restaurant and made contact with a group of five individuals

in the parking lot. The group informed me that they had been with the suspect in Friendly Village at lot number 293 a short time prior to the incident. I identified the five individuals (see listed witnesses) and gathered contact information for each of them. One of the individuals was identified as SCOTT MENDOZA, and he began to explain the events that had occurred prior to police being called to the location. According to SCOTT, the group had attended a funeral for a male named Arthur Purtee earlier in the evening at approximately 1900 hours. SCOTT explained that the suspect from the Perrysburg Township incident was BEAU PURTEE, that he was a cousin of Arthur Purtee, and that he had also attended the funeral. SCOTT then stated that the group left the funeral home and arrived at Friendly Village around 2130 hours. SCOTT told me that once they arrived at the location that BEAU began acting "belligerent" and "was very very intoxicated". SCOTT stated that he exited the trailer to call a family member of BEAU'S to inform him of his behavior. AMANDA MENDOZA then began to explain BEAU'S actions inside the trailer. According to AMANDA, BEAU continued to act belligerent and then removed a firearm that he had tucked in the front of his waistband. BEAU manipulated the firearm, removing the magazine to show AMANDA and DANNY that it was loaded to capacity. AMANDA stated that BEAU then began making "sexual innuendos" and made statements about "being the bad guy". AMANDA stated that she then left the location because of BEAU'S behavior. SCOTT then continued to explain his involvement and told me that BEAU then moved outside the trailer, became combative, began backing away from them, and started to make statements like "don't come any closer". SCOTT then shifted to telling me that as he was leaving the area he heard what he described as "fireworks or gunshots" several times and in different locations.

I concluded my contact with the group by providing business cards and informing them that Perrysburg Township detectives would likely be in contact with them soon.

Perrysburg Township dispatch was contacted and provided with identities and phone numbers for the witnesses.

Policy Manual

Use of Force

300.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

Best Practice

This policy provides guidelines on the reasonable use of force. While there is no way to specify the exact amount or type of reasonable force to be applied in any situation, every member of this department is expected to use these guidelines to make such decisions in a professional, impartial, and reasonable manner.

In addition to those methods, techniques, and tools set forth below, the guidelines for the reasonable application of force contained in this policy shall apply to all policies addressing the potential use of force, including but not limited to the Control Devices and Techniques and Conducted Energy Device policies.

300.1.1 DEFINITIONS

Federal MODIFIED

Definitions related to this policy include:

Deadly force - Force reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury.

Feasible - Reasonably capable of being done or carried out under the circumstances to successfully achieve the arrest or lawful objective without increasing risk to the officer or another person.

Force - The application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents, or weapons to another person. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed, or restrained.

Imminent - Ready to take place; impending. Note that imminent does not mean immediate or instantaneous.

Totality of the circumstances - All facts and circumstances known to the officer at the time, taken as a whole, including the conduct of the officer and the subject leading up to the use of force.

Reasonable - When used in this policy to describe the use of force, shall be construed to have the same meaning as the term "objectively reasonable," in accordance with the holding in Graham v. Connor, 490 U.S. 386 (1989).

300.2 POLICY

Best Practice | MODIFIED | OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (a) OCLEAC-2023 - 8.2015.1 (a)

The use of force by law enforcement personnel is a matter of critical concern, both to the public and to the law enforcement community. Officers are involved on a daily basis in numerous and varied interactions and, when warranted, may use reasonable force in carrying out their duties.

Use of Force

Officers must have an understanding of, and true appreciation for, their authority and limitations. This is especially true with respect to overcoming resistance while engaged in the performance of law enforcement duties.

The Department recognizes and respects the value of all human life and dignity without prejudice to anyone. Vesting officers with the authority to use objectivley reasonable force and to protect the public welfare requires monitoring, evaluation and a careful balancing of all interests.

300.2.1 DUTY TO INTERVENE AND REPORT

Federal OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (a)

Any officer present and observing another law enforcement officer or a member using force that is clearly beyond that which is objectively reasonable under the circumstances shall, when in a position to do so, intervene to prevent the use of unreasonable force.

Any officer who observes another law enforcement officer or a member use force that is potentially beyond that which is objectively reasonable under the circumstances should report these observations to a supervisor.

300.2.2 PERSPECTIVE

Best Practice

When observing or reporting force used by a law enforcement officer, each officer should take into account the totality of the circumstances and the possibility that other law enforcement officers may have additional information regarding the threat posed by the subject.

300.3 USE OF FORCE

Federal MODIFIED OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (a)

Officers shall use only that amount of force that appears objectively reasonable given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer at the time of the event to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

The reasonableness of force will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene at the time of the incident. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force that reasonably appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

Given that no policy can realistically predict every possible situation an officer might encounter, officers are entrusted to use well-reasoned discretion in determining the appropriate use of force in each incident.

It is also recognized that circumstances may arise in which officers reasonably believe that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the tools, weapons or methods provided by the Department. Officers may find it more effective or reasonable to improvise their response to rapidly unfolding conditions that they are confronting. In such circumstances, the use of any improvised

device or method must nonetheless be reasonable and utilized only to the degree that appears objectively reasonable to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

While the ultimate objective of every law enforcement encounter is to avoid or minimize injury, nothing in this policy requires an officer to retreat or be exposed to possible physical injury before applying objectively reasonable force.

300.3.1 USE OF FORCE TO EFFECT AN ARREST

Best Practice MODIFIED OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (a)

Any officer who has reasonable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed a crime or public offense may use objectively reasonable force to effect the arrest, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. An officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his/her efforts by reason of resistance or threatened resistance on the part of the person being arrested, nor shall an officer be deemed the aggressor or lose his/her right to self-defense by the use of objectively reasonable force to effect the arrest, prevent escape or to overcome resistance.

300.3.2 FACTORS USED TO DETERMINE THE REASONABLENESS OF FORCE

Federal OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (a)

When determining whether to apply force and evaluating whether an officer has used reasonable force, a number of factors should be taken into consideration, as time and circumstances permit. These factors include but are not limited to:

- (a) Immediacy and severity of the threat to officers or others.
- (b) The conduct of the individual being confronted, as reasonably perceived by the officer at the time.
- (c) Officer/subject factors (e.g., age, size, relative strength, skill level, injuries sustained, level of exhaustion or fatigue, the number of officers available vs. subjects).
- (d) The effects of suspected drug or alcohol use.
- (e) The individual's mental state or capacity.
- (f) The individual's ability to understand and comply with officer commands.
- (g) Proximity of weapons or dangerous improvised devices.
- (h) The degree to which the individual has been effectively restrained and the individual's ability to resist despite being restrained.
- The availability of other reasonable and feasible options and their possible effectiveness.
- (j) Seriousness of the suspected offense or reason for contact with the individual.
- (k) Training and experience of the officer.
- (I) Potential for injury to officers, suspects, and others.

- (m) Whether the individual appears to be resisting, attempting to evade arrest by flight, or is attacking the officer.
- (n) The risk and reasonably foreseeable consequences of escape.
- (o) The apparent need for immediate control of the individual or a prompt resolution of the situation.
- (p) Whether the conduct of the individual being confronted no longer reasonably appears to pose an imminent threat to the officer or others.
- (q) Prior contacts with the individual or awareness of any propensity for violence.
- (r) Any other exigent circumstances.

300.3.3 PAIN COMPLIANCE TECHNIQUES

Best Practice

Pain compliance techniques may be effective in controlling a physically or actively resisting individual. Officers may only apply those pain compliance techniques for which they have successfully completed department-approved training. Officers utilizing any pain compliance technique should consider:

- (a) The degree to which the application of the technique may be controlled given the level of resistance.
- (b) Whether the individual can comply with the direction or orders of the officer.
- (c) Whether the individual has been given sufficient opportunity to comply.

The application of any pain compliance technique shall be discontinued once the officer determines that compliance has been achieved.

300.3.4 CAROTID CONTROL HOLD

Best Practice

A carotid control hold is a technique designed to control an individual by temporarily restricting blood flow through the application of pressure to the side of the neck and, unlike a chokehold, does not restrict the airway. The proper application of the carotid control hold may be effective in restraining a violent or combative individual. However, due to the potential for injury, the use of the carotid control hold is limited to those circumstances where deadly force is authorized and is subject to the following:

- (a) At all times during the application of the carotid control hold, the response of the individual should be monitored. The carotid control hold should be discontinued when circumstances indicate that the application no longer reasonably appears necessary.
- (b) Any individual who has had the carotid control hold applied, regardless of whether he/ she was rendered unconscious, shall be promptly examined by paramedics or other qualified medical personnel and should be monitored until such examination occurs.
- (c) The officer shall inform any person receiving custody, or any person placed in a position of providing care, that the individual has been subjected to the carotid control hold and whether the individual lost consciousness as a result.

- (d) Any officer attempting or applying the carotid control hold shall promptly notify a supervisor of the use or attempted use of such hold.
- (e) The use or attempted use of the carotid control hold shall be thoroughly documented by the officer in any related reports.

300.3.5 USE OF FORCE TO SEIZE EVIDENCE

Best Practice MODIFIED

In general, officers may use objectively reasonable force to lawfully seize evidence and to prevent the destruction of evidence. However, officers are discouraged from using force solely to prevent a person from swallowing evidence or contraband. In the instance when force is used, officers should not intentionally use any technique that restricts blood flow to the head, restricts respiration or which creates a reasonable likelihood that blood flow to the head or respiration would be restricted. Officers are encouraged to use techniques and methods taught by the Perrysburg Township Police Department for this specific purpose.

300.3.6 ALTERNATIVE TACTICS - DE-ESCALATION

Best Practice

When circumstances reasonably permit, officers should use non-violent strategies and techniques to decrease the intensity of a situation, improve decision-making, improve communication, reduce the need for force, and increase voluntary compliance (e.g., summoning additional resources, formulating a plan, attempting verbal persuasion).

300.3.7 RESPIRATORY RESTRAINTS

Best Practice

The use of a respiratory restraint, also known as a chokehold, is limited to circumstances where deadly force is authorized and if applied, is subject to the same guidelines and requirements as a carotid control hold.

300.4 DEADLY FORCE APPLICATIONS

Federal OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (a)

When reasonable, the officer shall, prior to the use of deadly force, make efforts to identify themself as a peace officer and to warn that deadly force may be used, unless the officer has objectively reasonable grounds to believe the person is aware of those facts.

Use of deadly force is justified in the following circumstances involving imminent threat or imminent risk:

- (a) An officer may use deadly force to protect themself or others from what the officer reasonably believes is an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury.
- (b) An officer may use deadly force to stop a fleeing subject when the officer has probable cause to believe that the individual has committed, or intends to commit, a felony involving the infliction or threatened infliction of serious bodily injury or death, and the officer reasonably believes that there is an imminent risk of serious bodily injury or death to any other person if the individual is not immediately apprehended. Under

such circumstances, a verbal warning should precede the use of deadly force, where feasible.

However, an officer should not use deadly force against a person whose actions are a threat solely to themself or property.

Imminent does not mean immediate or instantaneous. An imminent danger may exist even if the suspect is not at that very moment pointing a weapon at someone. For example, an imminent danger may exist if an officer reasonably believes that the individual has a weapon or is attempting to access one and intends to use it against the officer or another person. An imminent danger may also exist if the individual is capable of causing serious bodily injury or death without a weapon, and the officer believes the individual intends to do so.

300.4.1 MOVING VEHICLES

Best Practice

Shots fired at or from a moving vehicle are rarely effective and involve considerations and risks in addition to the justification for the use of deadly force.

When feasible, officers should take reasonable steps to move out of the path of an approaching vehicle instead of discharging their firearm at the vehicle or any of its occupants.

An officer should only discharge a firearm at a moving vehicle or its occupants when the officer reasonably believes there are no other reasonable means available to avert the imminent threat of the vehicle, or if deadly force other than the vehicle is directed at the officer or others.

Officers should not shoot at any part of a vehicle in an attempt to disable the vehicle.

300.5 REPORTING THE USE OF FORCE

Best Practice OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (b) OCLEAC-2023 - 8.2015.1 (b)

Any use of force by a member of this department shall be documented promptly, completely, and accurately in an appropriate report, depending on the nature of the incident. The officer should articulate the factors perceived and why he/she believed the use of force was reasonable under the circumstances.

To collect data for purposes of training, resource allocation, analysis, and related purposes, the Department may require the completion of additional report forms, as specified in department policy, procedure, or law. See the Report Preparation Policy for additional circumstances that may require documentation.

300.5.1 NOTIFICATIONS TO SUPERVISORS

Best Practice OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (b) OCLEAC-2023 - 8.2015.1 (b)

Supervisory notification shall be made as soon as practicable following the application of force in any of the following circumstances:

(a) The application caused a visible injury.

- (b) The application would lead a reasonable officer to conclude that the individual may have experienced more than momentary discomfort.
- (c) The individual subjected to the force complained of injury or continuing pain.
- (d) The individual indicates intent to pursue litigation.
- (e) Any application of the conducted energy device or control device.
- (f) Any application of a restraint device other than handcuffs, shackles, or belly chains.
- (g) The individual subjected to the force was rendered unconscious.
- (h) An individual was struck or kicked.
- An individual alleges unreasonable force was used or that any of the above has occurred.

300.6 MEDICAL CONSIDERATIONS

Best Practice

Once it is reasonably safe to do so, medical assistance shall be obtained for any person who exhibits signs of physical distress, has sustained visible injury, expresses a complaint of injury or continuing pain, or was rendered unconscious. Any individual exhibiting signs of physical distress after an encounter should be continuously monitored until the individual can be medically assessed. Individuals should not be placed on their stomachs for an extended period, as this could impair their ability to breathe.

Based upon the officer's initial assessment of the nature and extent of the individual's injuries, medical assistance may consist of examination by an emergency medical services provider or medical personnel, at a hospital or jail. If any such individual refuses medical attention, such a refusal shall be fully documented in related reports and, whenever practicable, should be witnessed by another officer and/or medical personnel. If a recording is made of the contact or an interview with the individual, any refusal should be included in the recording, if possible.

The on-scene supervisor or, if the on-scene supervisor is not available, the primary handling officer shall ensure that any person providing medical care or receiving custody of a person following any use of force is informed that the person was subjected to force. This notification shall include a description of the force used and any other circumstances the officer reasonably believes would be potential safety or medical risks to the subject (e.g., prolonged struggle, extreme agitation, impaired respiration).

Individuals who exhibit extreme agitation, violent irrational behavior accompanied by profuse sweating, extraordinary strength beyond their physical characteristics, and imperviousness to pain, or who require a protracted physical encounter with multiple officers to be brought under control, may be at an increased risk of sudden death. Calls involving these persons should be considered medical emergencies. Officers who reasonably suspect a medical emergency should request medical assistance as soon as practicable and have medical personnel stage away.

See the Medical Aid and Response Policy for additional guidelines.

300.7 SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES

Best Practice OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (c) OCLEAC-2023 - 8.2015.1 (c)

A supervisor should respond to a reported application of force resulting in visible injury, if reasonably available. When a supervisor is able to respond to an incident in which there has been a reported application of force, the supervisor is expected to:

- (a) Obtain the basic facts from the involved officers. Absent an allegation of misconduct or excessive force, this will be considered a routine contact in the normal course of duties.
- (b) Ensure that any injured parties are examined and treated.
- (c) When possible, separately obtain a recorded interview with the individual upon whom force was applied. If this interview is conducted without the individual having voluntarily waived their *Miranda* rights, the following shall apply:
 - The content of the interview should not be summarized or included in any related criminal charges.
 - The fact that a recorded interview was conducted should be documented in a property or other report.
 - 3. The recording of the interview should be distinctly marked for retention until all potential for civil litigation has expired.
- (d) Once any initial medical assessment has been completed or first aid has been rendered, ensure that photographs have been taken of any areas involving visible injury or complaint of pain, as well as overall photographs of uninjured areas.
 - These photographs should be retained until all potential for civil litigation has expired.
- (e) Identify any witnesses not already included in related reports.
- (f) Review and approve all related reports for policy compliance.
- (g) Determine if there is any indication that the individual may pursue civil litigation.
 - 1. If there is an indication of potential civil litigation, the supervisor should complete and route a notification of a potential claim through the appropriate channels.
- (h) Evaluate the circumstances surrounding the incident and initiate an administrative investigation if there is a question of policy noncompliance or if for any reason further investigation may be appropriate.

In the event that a supervisor is unable to respond to the scene of an incident involving the reported application of force, the supervisor is still expected to complete as many of the above items as circumstances permit.

The Shift Supervisor shall review each use of force by any personnel within his/her command to ensure compliance with this policy and to address any training issues.

300.8 TRAINING

Best Practice OCLEAC-2021 - 8.2015.1 (d) OCLEAC-2023 - 8.2015.1 (d)

Officers shall receive annual training on this policy and demonstrate their knowledge and understanding.

Subject to available resources, officers should receive periodic training on guidelines regarding vulnerable populations, including but not limited to children, elderly, pregnant persons, and individuals with physical, mental, or intellectual disabilities.

300.8.1 POLICY ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND TESTING

Best Practice OCLEAC-2023 - 8.2015.1 (d)

Annually, applicable department members will read, sign, and be tested on this policy.

300.9 USE OF FORCE ANALYSIS

Best Practice

At least annually, the Patrol Division Supervisor should prepare an analysis report on use of force incidents. The report should be submitted to the Chief of Police. The report should not contain the names of officers, suspects or case numbers, and should include:

- (a) The identification of any trends in the use of force by members.
- (b) Training needs recommendations.
- (c) Equipment needs recommendations.
- (d) Policy revision recommendations.
