Narrative:

On 6/21/2022, Special Agent (SA) Tiffany Vollmer (Vollmer) met with Allen County Sheriff's Deputy Jared Breitigan (Breitigan) at the Allen County Sheriff's Department. Deputy Breitigan rode to the Lima Memorial Hospital with Deputy Ackerman. The purpose of the interview was to ascertain what information Deputy Breitigan may have that was helpful to the case. The following is a summary of the interview which was recorded and attached to the case file:

Deputy Breitigan said he was in the north end of Lima on Robb Avenue when Deputy Ackerman called out he was trying to stop a vehicle. Deputy Breitigan could hear Deputy Ackerman's sirens on when he keyed the mic. He then keyed the mic again and Deputy Breitigan said he heard him say, "Stop! Put your hands up!" He heard him say he was hit and to get an ambulance. Deputy Breitigan arrived and saw the injury on Deputy Ackerman's chin. He went and looked at the subject and saw he was deceased and had a gun on his chest.

Deputy Breitigan went back to Deputy Ackerman and asked if he shot that guy, and Deputy Ackerman said, "Yes." Deputy Breitigan took Deputy Ackerman's gun and put it in the back of Deputy Ackerman's cruiser. He described Deputy Ackerman as being alert. EMS arrived and he rode with Deputy Ackerman to Lima Memorial Hospital. Deputy Ackerman told him that he and the subject had went down to the ground after a foot pursuit, and he saw a muzzle blast close to his face and felt pain.

Deputy Breitigan saw a couple of civilians standing outside, but no one approached him with information.
