APPROVAL, CONTRACT BETWEEN STATE OF OHIO AND WILLIAMS-STONE-McCOY CO., OF COLUMBUS, OHIO, FOR CONSTRUCTION AND COMPLETION OF BITUMINOUS MACADAM ROAD AROUND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY GROUP, AT COST OF \$5,535.00. SURETY BOND EXECUTED BY THE ROYAL INDEMNITY COMPANY, OF NEW YORK.

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval contract between the state of Ohio, acting by the department of highways and public works, and Williams-Stone-McCoy Co., of Columbus, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of bituminous macadam road around animal husbandry group, and calls for an expenditure of \$5,535.00.

You have submitted the certificate of the director of finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. There has further been submitted a contract bond upon which the Royal Indemnity Company of New York, appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, informal bids were taken in pursuance to the authority of the board of control, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded.
