said the following officers (in this order) approached and made the initial assessment:
•
responded by covering with his rifle. Said he could see Wheeler positioned behind a piece of furniture, possibly a dresser, in the front room. said Wheeler immediately started throwing items at the entry team, but it happened so fast he could not observe what the objects were. Indicated it was communicated to him by the other officers on the entry team that one of the objects thrown was a knife. Said he and the rest of the entry team retreated to the back of the BearCat and that is when he learned had sustained a knife wound to the forearm.
indicated the negotiators continued to try and communicate with Wheeler, however these attempts were unsuccessful. described chemical munitions (gas) being deployed into the house during this time period. said officers on the rear of the residence communicated they observed Wheeler's location as being in the kitchen on the back side of the residence. said two attempts to deploy a drone into the residence were made with the first being unsuccessful due to Wheeler knocking the drone down. indicated the second attempt was successful. At this time, said the decision was made to make a second attempt with the entry team. estimated the above process to have taken a few hours.
In addition to himself, said the following officers were used during the second entry:
• Officer Mayberry
explained he and other officers had gas masks on during the entry which greatly hindered their ability to hear or communicate with each other.
said when they initially made entry, all he could observe would be Wheeler, or a part of Wheeler's body, appear from behind the kitchen threshold to throw various items at the entry team. described the environment in the front room as being in disarray with furniture turned over obstructing the entrance into the kitchen and a large number of CDs all over the floor. could move up to the threshold between the front room and

residence, prompting officers to approach the now open front door and assess the situation.

kitchen. said Wheeler grabbed "bunker" (commonly referred to as a ballistic shield) and was able to observe the two struggling with one another. said he was armed with a rifle at this time, however he did not take further action because he stated several times he believed did not observe any weapons. and Wheeler to be involved in a physical altercation over the bunker with no weapons present. later said that he has watched footage of the incident and now knows and has observed Wheeler to be armed with a 12-14 inch butcher knife during the above described altercation. indicated he observed, audible only, shoot his firearm four to five times and Wheeler disappear back into the kitchen area. described himself and other officers follow Wheeler's direction of travel through the kitchen area to steps leading to the basement. said he had to step over during this process as they were now on the ground. seeing a large amount of blood in the kitchen area. said Officer Mayberry, , and he held at the top of the stairs until other officers came in with and tried to locate Wheeler in the basement using a "throwbot" (robot with a camera with a remote viewing screen) and "tacview" (a camera on the end of an extendable pole with a remote viewing screen). and wheeler was ultimately located unresponsive in the basement with the tacview system, prompting the entry team to proceed into the basement. said he observed Wheeler slumped over on the ground and completely unresponsive. Wheeler was handcuffed by Officer Mayberry. believed Wheeler to be deceased at this time. Once the incident concluded, learned were stabbed and injured during the second entry. said he has watched the video footage available associated with this incident and indicated it did not substantially change anything from his point of view during the incident. repeatedly referenced initially not knowing why Wheeler until he later learned of the other officers' injuries as well as watching the footage. reiterated he now knows Wheeler was armed with a butcher knife during the incident when he was shot by indicated he did not know Wheeler or have any previous encounters with him.
