PETITION: TO AMEND UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION STATUTES BY AMENDMENT TO SECTION 4141.30, RC AND TO ENACT SUPPLEMENTAL SECTIONS 4141.281, 4141.301, 4141.302 RC—PURSUANT TO SECTION 3519.01 RC.

Dear Sir:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3519.01, Revised Code, on April 26, 1954 you submitted for my examination an initiative petition proposing to amend the Unemployment Compensation statutes of Ohio by the amendment of Section 4141.30, Revised Code, and the enactment of supplemental Sections 4141.281, 4141.301 and 4141.302, Revised Code, together with a summary of the same.

Section 3519.01, Revised Code, provides that "If in the opinion of the attorney general the summary is a fair and truthful statement of the proposed law * * *, he shall so certify." Under this statutory requirement, my consideration, of course, is confined to the question of whether the summary is a fair and truthful statement of the changes in the law as set out in the text of the proposed statutes contained in the initiative petition, without regard to the policy or wisdom of such proposal.

Upon examination of the summary and a comparison of such summary with the text of the proposed statutes, I find that such summary is a fair and truthful statement of the laws proposed by the initiative petition. The following certification is hereby made to be used as provided by law:

"Pursuant to the duties imposed upon me under the provisions of Section 3519.01, Revised Code, I hereby certify that the summary attached to the initiative petition, filed with me on April 26, 1954, is a fair and truthful statement of the laws proposed by such initiative petition.
