APPROVAL, LEASE TO ABANDONED MIAMI AND ERIE CANAL PROPERTY IN THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN, BUTLER COUNTY.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, January 10, 1929.

DEAR SIR:—This is to acknowledge the receipt from your department of an indenture of lease executed in triplicate by the State of Ohio, through you as Superintendent of Public Works and as Director of said department, leasing and demising unto the village of Franklin, Warren County, Ohio, all that portion of the abandoned Miami and Erie Canal property located in the village of Franklin, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Being all that portion of the abandoned Miami and Erie Canal within the corporate limits of the village of Franklin, Warren County, Ohio, commencing at the north corporation line of said village at or near Station 10282 plus 64 of H. C. Baldwin's survey of the Miami and Erie Canal, south of Dayton, Ohio, made under the direction of the State Board of Public Works in 1912, and extending thence southward over and along said Miami and Erie Canal, including the full width of the bed and embankments thereof, a distance of 6436 feet, more or less, to Station 10347, said Station being approximately 600 feet south of the south line of Sixth Street in said village.

Said lease is executed under the authority of the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, passed March 25, 1925, 111 O. L. 208, the same being an act to abandon for canal purposes that portion of the Miami and Erie Canal between the Maumee River at Defiance, Defiance County, Ohio, and a point 500 feet north of the Middletown dam, near the corporation line of the City of Middletown, Butler County, Ohio, and to provide for the leasing of certain portions of the same to cities, villages and other political subdivisions of the State, and for the granting of leases outside of municipalities. An examination of the provisions of said lease discloses that said lease is in form in all respects, in conformity to the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly above referred to and not inconsistent with any other applicable provisions of the statutory law of this State relating to the lease of canal lands. Said lease is accordingly hereby approved by me, and such approval is evidenced by my signature to the triplicate copies of said lease.
