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APPROVAL—RESERVOIR LAND LEASE TO LAND AT BUCK-EYE LAKE, OHIO—R. EDWARD WILLIAMS, M. D., CANAL WINCHESTER, OHIO.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, September 24, 1936.

Hon. Earl H. Hanefeld, Director, Department of Agriculture, Columbus, Ohio.

DEAR SIR: I am in receipt of a communication from the Chief of the Bureau of Inland Lakes and Parks, with which was submitted for my approval a certain reservoir land lease in triplicate, executed by the Conservation Commissioner to one R. Edward Williams, M. D., of Canal Winchester, Ohio.

By this lease, which is one for a term of fifteen years and which provides for an annual rental of \$24.00, there is leased and demised to the lessee above named, the right to occupy and use for cottage site and landing purposes, only, the inner slope and water front and the outer slope and borrow pit adjacent thereto that is included in the east half of embankment lot No. 13, west of the waste-gates at Buckeye Lake, as laid out by the Ohio Canal Commission on the north shore of said lake in 1905, and being part of the southeast quarter of Section 14, Town 17, Range 18, Licking County, Ohio.

Upon examination of this lease, I find that the same has been properly executed by the Conservation Commissioner and by said lessee. I further find, upon consideration of the provisions of this lease and of the conditions and restrictions therein contained, that the same are in conformity with Section 471, General Code, under the authority of which this lease is executed, and with other statutory enactments relating to leases of this kind.

I am accordingly approving this lease as to legality and form, as evidenced by my approval endorsed upon the lease and upon the duplicate and triplicate copies thereof, all of which are herewith returned.
