APPROVAL, LEASE TO OFFICE ROOMS IN REIBOLD BUILDING, DAY-
TON, OHIO, FOR USE OF DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRIAL RELA-

DEAR SIR:—There has been submitted for my approval, a lease granting to you, as Superintendent of Public Works, for the use of the Department of Industrial Relations, certain office rooms, as follows:

Lease from the Elder Building Company of Dayton, Ohio, for Rooms numbers 809, 810, 811, 812, 909 and 910 on the eighth and ninth floors of the Reibold Building, Dayton, Ohio. This lease is for a term of two years, beginning on the first day of January, 1933, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1934, by the terms of which the State will be required to pay one hundred and fifteen dollars (\$115.00) per month, in advance.

There has been submitted encumbrance estimate No. 108 of the Director of Finance, made in pursuance of section 2288-2, General Code.

A certificate shows that the board of directors of the Elder Building Company has authorized E. T. Reibold to execute this lease to bind the company.

It is noted that after the signature of T. S. Brindle on the lease, no designation appears to show that said party signs in the capacity of "Superintendent of Public Works." These words should be inserted beneath the signature. See Opinions of the Attorney General, 1928, volume I, page 66.

Finding said lease in proper legal form, with the exception made in the preceding paragraph, I hereby approve it as to form, subject to the insertion of the designated words, and return it herewith.
