PETITION, CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT, TO REPEAL SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 AND 11 OF ARTICLE XI BY SUBSTITUTION OF FIVE NEW SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 4 AND 5—MEMBERSHIP, GENERAL ASSEMBLY, HOUSE AND SENATE.

Dear Sir:

You have submitted for my examination a written petition bearing over one hundred names, containing a proposed constitutional amendment and a summary of the same under section 4785-175, General Code. It is proposed to amend the Constitution of the State of Ohio by repealing sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 of Article XI, and substituting therefor five new sections to be numbered 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. Copies of said proposed amendment and summary thereof are hereto attached. (See file, Attorney General).
