Narrative:

On Tuesday, December 20, 2022, the Marion County Sheriff's Office and Marion Police Department requested the assistance of the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) with the investigation of an Officer Involved Critical Incident which occurred in LaRue, Marion County, Ohio. During the investigation, Special Agent Jason Snyder was provided with the personnel file of Marion Police Department Officer ██████████ (██████). On Saturday, January 7, 2023, Special Agent Supervisor (SAS) Scott Stranahan reviewed Officer ██████'s personnel file and noted the following:

SAS Stranahan noted there were four separate files which contained personnel records, training records and firearms qualifications for Officer ██████. SAS Stranahan first reviewed a file titled "██████████ Personnel File." Investigation revealed the following. Officer ██████ attended the Police Academy at Marion Technical College. Upon graduation, Officer ██████ received a certificate from the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission in June of 2016. Also, in June of 2016, Officer ██████ was sworn in as Police Officer with the Marion Police Department.

SAS Stranahan noted Officer ██████ received the following awards. In January of 2021, Officer ██████ was given an "Exceptional Duty Award" for his response and assistance during a homicide investigation. In January of 2021, Officer ██████ received an "Exceptional Duty Award" for his response to a shooting call which resulted in a standoff with local SWAT teams. In April of 2021, Officer ██████ was given another "Exceptional Duty Award" for his a traffic stop he conducted that resulted in the seizure of drugs and United States Currency. In July of 2021, Officer ██████ received an "Exceptional Duty Award" for his response to a breaking and entering call which resulted in the apprehension of a subject wanted in connection with several house fires. In December of 2021, Officer ██████ received an "Exceptional Duty Award" for his response



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and assistance apprehending an individual with a knife who attempted flee, fought with officers and attempted to take an officer's firearm. It was also noted Officer █████ applied for internal positions within the Marion Police Department for Detective, SRT and Field Training Officer.

SAS Stranahan noted a disciplinary action which resulted in counseling in March of 2019 stemming from a motor vehicle accident involving the cruiser he was operating. Officer █████ also received counseling for another motor vehicle accident in June of 2021.

Officer █████ received authorization to carry the following firearms: Sig Sauer 9mm semi-automatic pistol, Palmetto PA-15 rifle, Glock 17 9mm semi-automatic pistol and a Glock 19x 9mm semi-automatic pistol.

SAS Stranahan next reviewed a file titled "██████████ Firearms Qualifications." Investigation revealed the following. This file contained firearms qualifications records and training certificates. The firearms records showed Officer █████'s qualification history from 2016 through 2022 on the following weapons systems: semi-automatic pistol, shotgun, rifle and submachine gun.


NARRATIVE

Incident / Investigation - Case #: 2020-04806 : Off. Narr

On 10-21-2020 I was dispatched to 840 Gebhart St reference a sex offense.

I made contact with the caller, Gerald Polley Jr, who lives in Hilliard Ohio over the phone. Gerald was calling to report that his step daughter, Isabella Thiel(12yo), received a naked photograph and sexual video involving her sister, Natalie Polley(13yo), and sisters ex boyfriend, Trinten Freeman(17yo).

Gerald advised he and Isabella live in Hilliard and that Natalie lives in Caledonia with her mother, Angela Topping. Gerald explained that Natalie had dated Trinten during the summer but had broken up. Gerald explained his displeasure that Natalie was dating a seventeen year old but was now very upset to learn that she had been having sex with him as well. Gerald advised that Trinten had added Isabella on Snapchat and this is where the conversations took place. Gerald explained Trinten was messaging Isabella to find out why Natalie has blocked him on all social media outlets. Gerald said this lead to Trinten stating Natalie doesn't want people to know the photographs and videos he has and then told Isabella that they had sex. Trinten then sent Isabella a naked photograph of Natalie and then two videos of Trinten and Natalie conducting sexual activity. Gerald was very upset Trinten would send this to his twelve year old daughter and stated that he did see the videos. Gerald stated Natalie seems to know that she was being recorded.

Isabella's mother and Gerald's wife, Elizabeth Polley, stated that she was the person Isabella first told about the photographs and videos. Elizabeth said she was downstairs when Isabella came running down to show her what Trinten had sent her. Elizabeth said she read the conversation and saw the photograph and videos. Elizabeth said she recorded the conversation on her phone because she knew they would disappear.

Gerald stated he has already been in contact with Natalie's mother about the situation.

The conversation with Gerald was on speaker phone and was recorded on my body camera.

I then went to 840 Gebhart St and made contact with Trinten's grandmother/custodial parent, Sally Freeman. Sally advised she knew why I was there and said she had already received a call from Angela about the situation. Sally explained that Trinten and Natalie dated during the summer when he was sixteen and believed Natalie was fourteen. Sally said she spoke with Trinten about it and he stated he never sent any photographs or videos. I informed Sally that Snapchat photographs, messages, and videos do not go away on the app and can still be searched and located. I asked Sally if she would allow me to seize Trinten's Iphone to be sent to Investigations to be searched and Sally stated she would let me have the phone. Sally then gave permission to speak with Trinten.

*****Interview with Trinten*****

Trinten handed me his Iphone which was then placed on Airplane mode and shut off. I asked Trinten what had happened and he admitted to messaging Isabella on Snapchat but denied ever sending a photograph or video. Trinten said that he dated Natalie during the summer when he was sixteen and stated Natalie lied to him at first about her age and said she was fourteen not thirteen. Trinten stated they had broken up and claims Isabella added him on Snapchat and he was asking her about Natalie blocking him on everything. I informed Trinten that even though the messages between him and Isabella have gone away and cannot be seen on the phone or in the app, with a search warrant all messages can still be obtained. I advised Trinten that his phone was going to be handed over to Investigations where all the messages between Isabella, Natalie, and himself will be obtained and that the truth will come out.

Trinten then admitted that he did send a naked photograph of Natalie to Isabella on Snapchat. Trinten stated that the photograph was taken at Natalie's house in Caledonia. Trinten stated that all sexual activity between him and Natalie occurred at her house in Caledonia. I advised Trinten that now that I know he lied about sending the photograph I asked if he also sent the video, Trinten then looked down and appeared to be looking for an answer and started looking upset. I then asked Trinten if he wanted to come to MPD with me for an interview and he stated yes.

I spoke with Sally again who gave consent for me to take Trinten to MPD for an interview. I then transported Trinten to MPD without incident.

I escorted Trinten to the MPD basement and he was sat in an interview room. I advised Trinten that he was not under arrest and that he could stop speaking with me anytime he wishes. Due to Trinten being in the basement I advised him of his Miranda Rights and he stated he understood and signed the Miranda Rights form.

I again began speaking with Trinten who advised he started dating Natalie around May 2020. Trinten said he met her on Snapchat and the two began talking more and more that lead to a relationship. Trinten said that Natalie first told him she was fourteen but he found out her real age of thirteen sometime in July. Trinten said the relationship continued until some time in August. Trinten explained that Natalie then blocked him on all social media outlets and this upset him because he believed they were good friends. Trinten stated that he attempted to make contact with Natalie yesterday asking her to unblock him and she replied "why?" and nothing else. Trinten states the next day(today) he received a friend request on Snapchat from Isabella that lead to a conversation between the two. Trinten admitted he was upset about the way Natalie had been treating him and was telling Isabella about how she is not the angel that they think she is. Isabella asked how that is and Trinten said he responded by telling her he had sex with Natalie. Trinten then said he sent the naked photograph of Natalie to Isabella followed by a video of him and Natalie.

Trinten advised that the video did not show any sexual intercourse and is a recording of him holding his penis and tapping it on Natalie's butt. Trinten said he blocked out his penis and blocked out Natalie's butt in the video. Trinten stated that Natalie would often ask him to record or take photographs of her. Trinten also stated that Natalie would often log into his snapchat account and take naked photographs of herself and save them to his account. Trinten stated he never took video or photographs of Natalie without her consent. Trinten explained he deleted most of the pictures and videos. I informed Trinten that Isabella's mother stated that he sent two videos and Trinten stated he could not remember what he sent but believed it to only be one.

Trinten stated that he has never sent any pictures or videos to any friends but did admit that back in July a photograph was forwarded to his friend, Juan Calderon(16yo), who is a mutual friend of both him and Isabella. Trinten also states Isabella was aware.

After completing the interview I transported Trinten back to 840 Gebhart St. Sally and Trinten both signed a consent to seize and search a cellular telephone form. Sally was also provided a receipt from the inventory form for seizing the cell phone.

A follow up request form was completed requesting Investigations seek a search warrant to request the Snapchat conversations between he and Isabella, along to check for further photographs of an underage minor.
