Dear Sir:—You have submitted for my examination and opinion a lease between the Capitol Square Corporation, of Columbus, Ohio, as lessor, and the State of Ohio, acting by and through yourself, as Superintendent of Public Works, for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, as lessee.
