PAROLE FORMS—APPROVED FOR PUBLICATION—NOTICE OF APPLI-
CATION—OHIO PENITENTIARY—OHIO REFORMATORY.

SYLLABUS:

Forms of notice of applications for parole of prisoners of the Ohio Penitentiary and the Ohio State Reformatory to be published in accordance with the provisions of Sections 2171 and 2142, General Code, prepared and approved.

DEAR SIR:—This will acknowledge your letter dated May 28, 1928, which reads:

“In your opinion No. 2094 rendered to this Department under date of May 14, 1928, on page 10 you take exception to the form of notice of application for parole submitted.

We shall appreciate it if you will submit a proper form for advertising notices for applications for parole for prisoners of (1) the Ohio Penitentiary (2) the Ohio State Reformatory and (3) the Ohio Reformatory for Women (if advertising is required for the last named institution). We would suggest that this form should be as brief as possible to comply with the legal requirements since the state must pay for this advertising.”

In accord with your request I submit the following forms for advertising notices for applications for parole of prisoners of the following institutions:

For the Ohio Penitentiary—

“----- (Name of Prisoner)-----, a prisoner now confined in the Ohio Penitentiary, has been recommended to the Ohio Board of Clemency by the Warden and the Chaplain of the Ohio Penitentiary as worthy of consideration for parole. Said application will be for hearing on and after -----”

For the Ohio State Reformatory—

“----- (Name of Prisoner)-----, a prisoner now confined in the Ohio State Reformatory, has been recommended to the Ohio Board of Clemency by the Superintendent and the Chaplain of the Ohio State Reformatory as worthy of consideration for parole. Said application will be for hearing on and after -----”

No section of the General Code requires publication of such a notice with regard to inmates of the Ohio Reformatory for Women.
