DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval the contract between the State of Ohio, acting through you as Director of the Depart-

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ment of Public Works for the Board of Trustees of the Ohio State University, and E. Elford and Son, a firm composed of E. Elford and H. Elford, of Columbus, Ohio, for the construction and completion of General Contract (Division 1—Items I to XVI incl.) for the Men's Dormitory on the campus of the Ohio State University, as set forth in the General Conditions and the specifications for same, including Addendum No. 1 dated March 11, 1939, Addendum No. 2 dated March 17, 1939, and Addendum No. 3 dated March 20, 1939, and as covered by form of proposal dated March 22, 1939.
