Narrative:

On October 5, 2022, at 1205 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Jon Lieber (Lieber) arrived at the Springfield Township Police Department and met with Sergeant (Sgt.) Joe Gaffney (Gaffney) and Chief Jack Simone (Simone). Both officers voluntarily identified themselves as being involved in the incident occurring earlier that morning and resulting in an officer-involved shooting. Both officers consented to being photographed by SA Lieber. SA Lieber was informed that the officers' firearms had been previously collected and secured at the scene of the shooting. The shooting occurred in the backyard of 2347 E. Waterloo Road, Akron (Springfield Twp.), OH 44312.
