DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my examination and approval certain leases executed to the State of Ohio by several property owners in Flatrock Township, Henry County, Ohio, leasing and demising to the State for the purpose therein stated tracts of land in said township and county.

The leases here in question, designated with respect to the number of the lease, the owner of the property and the acreage of land covered by the respective leases, are as follows:

Each and all of these leases are for a term five (5) years and in each instance the property described is leased to the state for the sole purpose of a state game refuge. And, in this connection, it is noted that as to each of these leases the Conservation Council, acting through you as Conservation Commissioner, has made an order setting aside the lands described in the lease for the purpose of a state game and bird refuge, as provided for in Section 1430-1, General Code.

Upon examination of these leases, I find that the same have been

executed and acknowledged by the respective lessors in the manner provided by law. I also find upon examination of the provisions of these leases and of the conditions and restrictions therein contained, that the same are in conformity with statutory provisions relating to the execution of leases of this kind.

I am accordingly approving these leases as to legality and form, as is evidenced by my approval endorsed upon the several leases and upon the duplicate copies thereof, all of which are herewith returned.

APPROVAL—CONTRACT FOR PLUMBING WORK FOR PROJECT KNOWN AS COTTAGES A AND B, GIRLS' INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL, DELAWARE, OHIO, \$9,000, UNITED STATES FIDELITY AND GUARANTY CO., BALTIMORE, MD., SURETY—KAUFFMANN PLUMBING AND HEATING CO., INC., CANTON, OHIO—CONTRACTOR.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Welfare, and The Kaufmann Plumbing and Heating Co., Inc., of Canton, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of plumbing work for a project known as Cottages A and B, Girls' Industrial School, Delaware, Ohio, in accordance with Item No. 2 of the form of proposal dated April 30, 1936. Said contract calls for an expenditure of nine thousand dollars (\$9,000).

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have also submitted certificates of the Controlling Board showing that such board has released funds for this project in accordance with Section 1 of House Bill No. 69 of the second special session of the 90th General Assembly, and Section 1 of House Bill No. 504 of the regular session of the 91st General Assembly.
