Narrative:

On Monday, 30, 2026, at 1500hrs, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Dan Boerner (SA Boerner) arrived at the Ohio State Highway Patrol (OSP) Steubenville Post located at 1377 Cadiz Rd., Wintersville, Ohio 43953, to make contact with the involved trooper and to collect any evidence relevant to the Monday, March 30, 2026, officer-involved critical incident.

SA Boerner met with Lieutenant Robert Bodo (Lt. Bodo), Sergeant Tim Cunningham (Sgt. Cunningham), and [REDACTED] stated that he fired his duty weapon during the incident. [REDACTED] stated that after the shooting he secured his firearm in an evidence locker at the Post. [REDACTED] stated that his attorney (Jaclyn R. Tipton ((Atty. Tipton)) requested that investigators wait to examine his firearm until she was present. [REDACTED] stated that Atty. Tipton did give permission for investigators to photograph [REDACTED] in his uniform without her being present.

SA Boerner proceeded to photograph [REDACTED] as he was found (*Figures 1-3*, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] While photographing [REDACTED], SA Boerner asked [REDACTED] if he had physical contact with the subject during the incident. [REDACTED] stated that he did not. SA Boerner asked [REDACTED] if he reloaded his firearm during the incident and [REDACTED] stated that he did. [REDACTED] stated that his firearm jammed and that he seated a new magazine. [REDACTED] stated that he did not fire after he loaded a new magazine.

At approximately 1700hrs, Atty. Tipton arrived at the Post. Atty. Tipton stated that [REDACTED] would provide a written statement at a later date and answer additional questions, if necessary.

At approximately 1720hrs, SA Boerner received [REDACTED] firearm and three magazines from Sgt. Cunningham. [REDACTED]'s firearm had been previously made safe. [REDACTED] firearm was a black, semi-automatic Sig Sauer P320, 9mm, with SN: [REDACTED]. There was one loose cartridge, reportedly from the chamber, and three (3) magazines containing eleven (11), sixteen (16), and seventeen (17) cartridges each (Figures 4-5, [REDACTED] firearm). [REDACTED] reported that the magazine containing the least number of cartridges was the one used during the incident. [REDACTED] stated that the magazine containing sixteen (16) magazines was the magazine seated after the jam. [REDACTED] firearm, loose cartridge, and magazine with eleven (11) cartridges were collected as evidence (Item 1). The remaining magazines were returned to Sgt. Cunningham. An Ohio BCI Inventory/Receipt Attachment was completed and provided to Sgt. Cunningham.

While speaking with [REDACTED] was provided with a copy of Marsy's Law paperwork. SA Boerner requested that [REDACTED] complete the paperwork and provide SA Boerner with a copy of the same.

At 2020hrs, SA Boerner transported [REDACTED] firearm to the Ohio BCI office in Richfield. The firearm was subsequently placed into temporary evidence locker number 2 (#2).
