

### **Investigative Request**

On Tuesday, November 14, 2023, Chief Mark Kaye of the Garfield Heights Police Department requested the assistance of the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation's (BCI) Special Investigations Unit (SIU) and Crime Scene Unit (CSU) in conducting an independent investigation into the facts and circumstances surrounding an officer-involved shooting incident. The incident reportedly occurred on November 14, 2023 in the area of 6235 Hathaway Road and resulted in the death of Benard Russell.


### Preface:

This report serves as a synopsis of the investigation into the November 14, 2023 officer-involved shooting in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. This report only summarizes the information that the investigative team determined to be the most useful in achieving an overall understanding of what occurred in this incident. Every fact and detail is not presented in this summary report. Therefore, it is recommended that each individual report from which this document is derived be read to obtain a complete understanding of this investigation. Further, audio and/or video recordings exist for most of the interviews conducted, revealing further details of statements given regarding the incident.

This investigation was conducted with the purpose of determining, to the extent possible, the facts and circumstances surrounding this incident. As unbiased collectors of fact, the investigative team has not and will not render any opinion of the legality of officers' actions. Instead, it is anticipated that this investigation will provide the basis of information for decisions to be rendered by the appropriate authorities.

### **Investigative Team**

BCI Special Agent Joseph Goudy (Goudy) was assigned as the lead SIU case agent. SA Goudy received assistance in the investigation from SA Cory Momchilov (Momchilov) and SA Andrew Harasimchuk (Harasimchuk). BCI Special Agents Ed Staley (Staley) and Crime Scene Technician (CST) Mike Rostocil (Rostocil) of the Crime Scene Unit processed the scene of the incident, documenting, preserving, and collecting possible evidence. BCI Computer Forensic Specialist (CFS) Natasha Branam of the Cyber Crimes Unit conducted an extraction and analysis of Matrix Item #14 – Blue Motorola, Moto g power cellular phone recovered from the computer desk in the basement nearby where Benard Russell was located. The investigation was supervised by Special Agent Supervisor, Jon Lieber. Additionally, various personnel from the BCI crime laboratory performed scientific analyses on submitted items of potential physical evidence.


### **Summary of Process**

The following is a partial list of investigative activities or methods which were employed during this investigation, by the investigative team, to thoroughly and accurately locate and document all pertinent facts and circumstances regarding this incident:

- Recorded interview(s) of the 2 officers who discharged their weapons.
- Recorded interviews of 3 officers who were involved in the incident, at the scene, or otherwise deemed to potentially have relevant information.
- Neighborhood canvass of the area surrounding the scene
- Recorded interview(s) of the involved subject and others subjects directly involved in the incident.
- Interviews of 5 civilian witnesses to the incident
- Interviews of family members or associates of the decedent
- Special agent attendance to postmortem examination (autopsy) of the deceased
- Obtained and reviewed postmortem examination (autopsy) and toxicology reports.
- Obtained and reviewed police reports of prior law enforcement contacts with the subject
- Obtained and reviewed open and closed-source biographical information on the involved subjects, to include criminal history reports, OHLEG, driving records, etc.
- Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) trace on any non-law enforcement weapons involved in the incident (to determine ownership history)
- Review of all available body cameras involved in the incident.
- Review of Automated Vehicle Locator (AVL) data for all equipped police vehicles

- Processing of the scene for potential evidence (photographing, searching, measuring, documenting, and collecting)
- 3D scans / model of incident area
- Reviewed audio communications on the radio frequencies utilized during the incident.
- Review of 911/phone communications related to the incident.
- Review of dispatch/CAD records pertaining to the incident
- Review of Mobile Data Terminal (MDT) communications relative to the incident
- Reviewed phone/text records obtained via search warrant from wireless service provider.
- Review of the department's reports, photographs, and investigative materials pertaining to the incident, excluding any Garrity statements or information derived from any compelled statement.
- Obtained search warrants for the subject's phone and performed an analysis of the data present.
- Conducted forensic laboratory examinations to include:
  - 1. Firearm identification testing of involved firearms, casings, and bullets.
  - 2. Firearm operability testing
  - 3. Gunshot residue testing (GSR)
  - 4. DNA
- Obtained search warrant to analyze electronic evidence, to include:
  - 1. Cellular phones
- Reviewed data obtained from aforementioned items of electronic evidence.
- Collected and reviewed the departmental personnel files of the officers involved in the shooting, to include training and disciplinary records (if any)
- Reviewed firearm qualification and training records for involved officers.
- Verified the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) certification status of the officer(s) who discharged their weapons.
- Obtained the department's policies and procedures regarding use of force for prosecutorial review.
- Enhancement of audio/video recordings through the assistance of the Ohio Organized Crime Investigations Commission
- Reviewed medical records of those injured, obtained through court order
- Reviewed EMS records pertaining to their response and the treatment administered.
- Reviewed tips, social media posts, and pertinent statements made in the media regarding the incident.

### Incident Summary/Overview

On Tuesday, November 14, 2023 at 1225 hours, the Garfield Heights Police Dispatch Center received a call from Benard Russell (Russell) asking for the number to the suicide hotline. Shortly thereafter, Russell hung up the phone. Garfield Heights Police (GHPD) officers were dispatched immediately to his residence, located at 6235 Hathaway Road. When officers arrived on scene at 1232 hours, they met with Russell's wife, Wilma Jean Russell (Wilma) at the front door. After Wilma let GHPD officers into the residence, she indicated that she and Russell have been having marital issues along with a disagreement over the disbursement of an inheritance Wilma received from her late grandmother's estate over the past week. Wilma stated Russell was in the basement. When officers attempted to go into the basement, the basement door was locked. Wilma then gave the officers a key to access the basement from a rear exterior door.

When officers entered the rear exterior door to the basement, they encountered Russell sitting in a chair holding a handgun to his head. During this time, officers attempted to negotiate with Russell to put the gun down and to comply with their orders. Russell refused to comply and insisted that officers leave him alone. As officers continued to negotiate, Russell began to lower his gun down from his head and pointed it in the officer's direction. It was at this point when officers fired their duty weapons, striking Russell. After the gunshots were fired, officers moved up to secure Russell and began to render emergency medical aid to him. Russell was eventually transported to Marymount Hospital where he eventually succumbed to his injuries.





### **Autopsy Report**

The autopsy report for the decedent (Benard Russell) was obtained from the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office. A review of those documents revealed the following information:



### **Physical Evidence**

Multiple agents responded and processed the scene, including photographing and mapping the area, as well as the search for, documentation, and collection of items of possible evidence. 



The BCI Firearms Section performed an analysis of the officers' firearms, as well as the firearm-related evidence collected from the scene, vehicles, and autopsies (casings and bullets). By comparing evidentiary cartridge casings/projectiles to known standards from each weapon, identifications were able to be made as to which casings/projectiles were fired from each firearm. Of the casings/projectiles recovered, the following identifications were made:



#### Witnesses

#### Wilma Russell (Wife of Benard Russel)

During SA Momchilov and SA Harasimchuk's interview with Wilma, Wilma provided details of a recent and ongoing disagreement she had with Benard. However, Wilma did not provide the details chronologically.

Below is a summary of Wilma's statement to investigators, regarding her and Benard's recent disagreement in chronological order.

Wilma inherited \$60,000 from her grandmother who recently passed away and was the sole beneficiary. Wilma wanted to share some of the money with her other siblings and had contacted a probate attorney. Benard overheard a conversation that occurred on Friday, November 10, 2023, between Wilma and the attorney. Benard disagreed with Wilma's decision and the two discussed the matter. According to Wilma, Benard "put a squash on it."

On Tuesday, November 14, 2023, Wilma advised her and Benard had a "deep family conversation." Wilma advised that during that conversation she brought up past infidelity issues and the conversation "shook" Benard.

#### **Officer Interviews**

The following paragraphs are summaries of each officer's account of his or her actions pertaining to this incident and/or discharging their weapon. More detailed accounts can be found by reading the separate reports written by the interviewers and by reviewing the recordings of each interview.

As "cautiously" made her way to the front door, walked around towards the rear of the residence. After began knocking on the front door, a female opened the door and, "looked very confused as to why we were there." After advising the female of the reason for them being there, stated the female "seemed very annoyed." further stated that the female wasn't annoyed because they were there but just annoyed at the situation.
The female told that it was probably her husband and he's in the basement. When asked the female if there were any weapons in the house, the female paused for a second, but then said, "no." At this point, the female was leading and through the house to the basement door. When tried to open the door, it was locked. Then stated that the female retrieved the keys to another basement door. The female stated that door can be accessed from outside the rear of the residence.
After retrieving the keys to the basement door, stated she began knocking on the door and used the doorbell. While she was knocking on the door, she said, "Benard, Its Garfield nothing, no answer." stated she did not hear or see anything. Prior to opening the door, stated she was peeking through a little window on the door and saw a room with no one there. At this point, decided to use the keys to enter the basement.
When entered the basement, she stated, "Benard, you in here, its Garfield Police." stated she heard mumbling and knew he was close by. stated she went to the right and went to the left. When went around the corner, she saw the male Benard Russell (Benard) sitting in an office chair with a gun pointed to his head. At this point Benard yelled out to get the light out of his face. stated she lowered her light and gun knowing that was positioned to her left.
stated she "tried very hard to talk to him and to get him to put the gun down, he, uh, didn't want to." Benard wanted to leave, and replied, "I couldn't leave, I said I can't leave you. I can't do that." stated that Benard told her, "Then pull up a chair and enjoy the show." replied, "please don't do that, please don't do that. He was giving off indications he was going to pull the trigger." At one-point Benard puts his head in his lap and mumbles. "We all die someday." stated, "No Benard, please don't do this." Shortly after that, offered to take Benard to go get help if he puts down the gun. stated Benard asked her "if she wanted to go home to her family too." stated Benard didn't really respond to anything other than asking if she wanted to go home to her family again.

At this point, additional GHPD officers were entering the basement, and it was upsetting Benard. then stated, "Benard lowered the handgun right at me, and uh, I remember screaming no!" At this point, began to fire her weapon at Benard. As Benard fell from his chair, Benard was yelling and still had the gun gripped in his hand. stated she wasn't sure exactly where the gun was located after he went to the ground. wanted to move up quickly to administer first aid. Shortly thereafter, heard another shot which was fired by began to administer emergency first aid.

explained he was in the parking lot, Garfield Height Police Department, sitting in his cruiser. While in the parking lot, advised he was assigned a welfare check call from dispatch. was informed that dispatch had received a call, from a male, who wanted the phone number to the suicide hotline. The male then hung up the phone.
advised that he and Unit were assigned the call. Stated he left the police department and proceeded to the scene (6235 Hathaway Road). Stated, "I looked at my CAD (Computer-Aided Dispatch) map where the house was situated, and it was between two side streets and right in the middle and I think there were like 6 or 7 houses between those side streets. I parked, we haven't been there, it was just a weird call, the way the call came in and then the, I asked radio (Dispatch) if we had any history at the house and they said, 'not since 2009' like barking dog complaints but there might be a person there with a lot of weapons and that's all I got."
Officers then approached the house and was able to make contact with someone inside the residence by knocking on the front door. then approached solution is location and met with a female, who described as the wife of the "person." The female was later identified as Wilma Russell (Wilma).
explained that officers told Wilma that they had received a 911 call from a cellular phone that traced back to the residence. According to advised that Wilma seemed surprised and stated, "Well I didn't call you." informed Wilma that it was a male caller and asked if anyone else was home. According to

Wilma replied, "My husband, he called?" Wilma seemed "a little frustrated" that her husband would have called. Wilma then informed officers that her husband, later identified as Benard Russell (Benard), was in the basement.
explained that Wilma "guided" officers through the house, past the kitchen.  stated he asked Wilma if she and Benard had some sort of fight.  advised that Wilma replied, "We had a discussion about divorce."  stated that went to the basement door and discovered it was locked.  then asked Wilma if Benard had any weapons and she replied, "I don't think so." Wilma then handed a key that was to the outside entrance to the basement and stated, "This is the key to the basement door that's outside, you have to go outside, I don't know why he's locking the door."
stated before they went outside, he again asked Wilma, "Are you sure he doesn't have any weapons?" According to Wilma replied, "I don't think so." approached the outside basement door and rang the doorbell, while calling out Benard's name and knocking on the door.
stated, "We get into this rec room, it's like this dark paneled, just spooky looking room." explained that straight ahead and off to his right he observed a threshold which appeared to lead into a room." Off to sleft, he observed another threshold which led into a "small, really dark room." Through that room, stated he observed another threshold that "with a little bit more light in it but all in all it was kind of dim."
stated that he started to walk with towards the first threshold and that he observed lean in and say, "Hey Benard, hey why don't you put that gun down." explained that he immediately went to the left, towards the darkened room and he believed that he already had his firearm out.



Lt. Berdysz advised that once he reached the residence, he remembered seeing a FedEx driver approaching the house. Lt. Berdysz further advised that he requested the FedEx driver to leave. Lt. Berdysz and another officer, Detective Mark Lee (Detective Lee), then began walking down the driveway toward the rear of the residence. Lt. Berdysz went to the "main back entrance" that led into a kitchen where Lt. Berdysz was "Greeted by the subject's wife." The wife was later identified as Wilma Russell (Wilma).
Lt. Berdysz stated, "And I remember her kind of indifferent to the matter. I said, 'ma'am how do we get downstairs, how do we get downstairs?' and I don't remember exactly what she said but she said 'you're gonna have to go outside, they're down there,' something along those lines." Lt. Berdysz advised that he then instructed the female to leave the house. Lt. Berdysz described the female as being "a tiny bit hesitant" at which point Lt. One of the officers radioed in that the male had a gun to his head and that they needed more units. When Det. Lee arrived on scene, gave Det. Lee the keys to retrieve a shield and less lethal. As soon as Det Lee exited the basement to retrieve those items, that is when Det. Lee heard the gunshots being fired. Det Lee stated he heard approximately 10 gunshots fired. When Det Lee re-entered the basement, he began to assist with administering emergency aid. During the short time Det Lee was inside the basement, he stated he was not able to see where Benard Russell was located prior to the shooting.

### Conclusion

On Tuesday, November 14, 2023 at 1225 hours, the Garfield Heights Police Dispatch Center received a call from Benard Russell (Russell) asking for the number to the suicide hotline. Shortly thereafter, Russell hung up the phone. Garfield Heights Police (GHPD) officers were dispatched immediately to his residence, located at 6235 Hathaway Road. When officers arrived on scene at 1232 hours, they met with Russell's wife, Wilma Jean Russell (Wilma), at the front door. After Wilma let GHPD officers into the residence, she stated that she and Russell have been having marital issues along with a disagreement over the disbursement of an inheritance Wilma received from her late grandmother's estate over the past week. Wilma stated Russell was in the basement. When officers attempted to go into the basement, the basement door was locked. Wilma then gave the officers a key to access the basement from a rear exterior door.

When officers entered the rear exterior door to the basement, they encountered Russell sitting in a chair holding a handgun to his head. During this time, officers attempted to

negotiate with Russell to put the gun down and to comply with their orders. Russell refused to comply and insisted that officers leave him alone. As officers continued to negotiate, Russell began to lower his gun down from his head and pointed it in the officer's direction. It was at this point when officers fired their duty weapons, striking Russell. After the gunshots were fired, officers moved up to secure Russell and began to render emergency medical aid to him. Russell was eventually transported to Marymount Hospital where he eventually succumbed to his injuries.

During the investigation, it was discovered that Wilma and Russell had a conversation earlier in the day about their marital issues which included Russell's past infidelity and divorce. Wilma stated that conversation "shook him." Wilma also mentioned there was a note that was passed between Russell and her discussing what to do with money she (Wilma) received from her late grandmother's estate. Russell wanted to keep all the money for themselves while Wilma wanted to divide it up amongst her siblings and the church that helped her grandmother. When officers arrived at the residence, Wilma was heard mentioning on body camera video that they discussed divorce.

During the negotiations, Russell was heard on body camera video repeatedly making comments such as, "We all die" and "It's time to die." At one point just prior to the officers discharging their firearms, Russell was also heard saying, "then pull up a chair and enjoy the show" as he continued to hold the handgun to his head.
