PETITION, CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT, TO REPEAL SECTION 12 OF ARTICLE XI; TO CHANGE SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 10, 12, 13, 14 AND 15 OF ARTICLE IV; TO ADOPT AND ADD TO ARTICLE IV TEN NEW SECTIONS 1a, 13a, 13b, 13c, 13d, 13e, 13f, 13g, 14a, 14b; TO ADOPT AND ADD TO ARTICLE X SECTION 18; TO CHANGE SECTION 4 OF ARTICLE XV AND SECTION 2 OF ARTICLE XVII.

Dear Sir:

You have submitted for my examination a written petition bearing over one hundred names, containing a proposed constitutional amendment and a summary of the same under section 4785-175, General Code. It is proposed to amend the Constitution of the State of Ohio by repealing Section 12 of Article XI; by changing Sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 10, 12, 13, 14 and 15 of Article IV; by adopting and adding to Article IV ten new sections (i.e., Sections 1a, 13a, 13b, 13c, 13d, 13e, 13f, 13g, 14a and 14b); by adopting and adding to Article X one new section (i.e., Section 18) and by changing Section 4 of Article XV and Section 2 of Article XVII. Copies of said proposed amendment and summary thereof are hereto attached. (See file, Attorney General.)

I am of the opinion that the attached summary is a fair and truthful statement of the proposed constitutional amendment and accordingly submit for uses provided by law the following certification:

Herbert, Attorney General of the State of Ohio, pursuant to the duties imposed upon me under the provisions of section 4785-175 of the General Code of Ohio, hereby certify that, in my opinion, the attached summary is a fair and truthful statement of the proposed amendment of the Constitution of Ohio to amend by repealing Section 12 of Article XI; by changing Sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 10, 12, 13, 14 and 15 of Article IV; by adopting and adding to Article IV ten new sections (i. e., Sections 1a, 13a, 13b, 13c, 13d, 13e, 13f, 13g, 14a and 14b); by adopting and

adding to Article X one new section (i. e., Section 18); and by changing Section 4 of Article XV and section 2 of Article XVII.”
