Narrative:

On August 23, 2023, while Special Agent (SA) Cory Momchilov (Momchilov) was on scene of the incident, he spoke with Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team (MVCRT) Commander John Elberty (Commander Elberty).

SA Momchilov advised Commander Elberty that the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) would need records and documents pertaining to the (MVCRT) those records included, information about the position of team members at the time of the shooting, witness officer information, team training records, team policy, etc.

SA Momchilov also asked Commander Elberty if team members write reports after an operation. Commander Elberty advised that it was not a standard procedure. SA Momchilov explained that due to the large amount of team members on scene that may not have witnessed the shooting (perimeter duties, traffic control etc.), SA Momchilov asked if it was possible if team members author a report stating their position at the time of the shooting and if they had witnessed any portion of the shooting.

On October 2, 2023, SA Momchilov received documents from Commander Elberty. SA reviewed the 15 documents that Commander Elberty provided.

This document, along with the attached documents, are the requested records for the Officer Involved Shooting Incident of August 22nd, 2023, involving Youngstown Police Department OFFICERS [REDACTED] acting in their capacity as Tactical Operators with the MAHONING VALLEY CRISIS RESPONSE TEAM SWAT (MVCRT SWAT).

To preface the requested Use of Force Policy documents, and the MVCRT SWAT team training associated with these documents and Use of Force in general, the first portion of this document will address the MVCRT SWAT operational and training philosophy of the team, and how it then relates specifically to Use of Force training within the team.

The MVCRT SWAT conducts both operations and training based on "principles". The goal of utilizing principles is to employ a system of tactics and techniques that are applicable to critical situations that the MVCRT SWAT responds to. These principles include, but are not limited to, concepts such as safety of hostages as a priority, utilizing negotiation techniques that are proven, and tactical movement that can be utilized in a warrant arrest as well as a hostage rescue.

To ensure that the MVCRT SWAT is mission capable to respond to and effectively mitigate critical situations such as the Howland Township OIS incident, team and individual training of every member is critical to being prepared.

This preparedness is achieved through the following:

- Since 2003, Tactical Operators attend training two days a month; with those days being generally one tactics day and one firearms / range day.
- Marksmen / Observers generally conduct an extra day on sniper aspects.
- A forty hour "SWAT WEEK" is conducted to bring together the years' worth of training and operational aspects into a scenario-based event.
- Crisis Negotiator Officers attend training one day a month and participate in extra events such as role-playing for local CIT classes and the FBI Basic Negotiator Course.
- Tactical Medical Unit members conduct and participate in various training events.
- Tactical Operation Center members participate in various training events throughout the year.

The next layer of being mission capable is to ensure that the training being conducted is accomplishing the goal of enabling the MVCRT SWAT to be prepared for the high-risk, high-stress situations they may have to respond to.

- To accomplish this, the yearly training plan is based on the following four tenets:
1. **Behavior Based.** Human behavior, such as reacting to direct gunfire as one example, when examined in detail will show repeated trends and tendencies as to how people generally react. Training curriculum is then developed to maximize the positive human reactions and minimize the negative reactions.
 2. **Scenario Based.** Potential situations that the MVCRT SWAT could respond to are recreated to replicate those situations, with multiple aspects and possible outcomes that could occur. It creates a tough and realistic training environment that mirrors real-life operational conditions.
 3. **Retainable.** The tactics and techniques developed are basic as possible, so they can be easily retained and rehearsed.
 4. **Repeatable.** The tactics and techniques that are utilized not only can be replicated in a training environment, but during an extremely high stress incident such as an Active Threat or Hostage Rescue situation.
- As stated, this document is to put into context the training philosophy of the MVCRT SWAT, and the methodology, to achieve mission readiness. Training and training documentation have evolved far past the prior methods such as specific "1,2,3, steps" or hour by hour tasking schedules as examples.
- Regarding the Use of Force Policy and training records requested, and how they relate to the four tenets of training explained, the following are enclosed on this USB drive:

The students will complete multiple fast-paced field training exercises that will improve and enhance tactical skills.

OTOA GRANT FUNDED TRAINING - OTOA Tactical Team Response to Active Threat Course

Who is eligible for the Tactical Team Response to Active Threat Course?
CPTIC-certified peace officers and troopers who are assigned full- or part-time to an Ohio law enforcement tactical team.

Is this course grant funded and eligible for tuition/course fee reimbursement?
YES.
The training costs \$750 per peace officer/trooper, to be paid by the home agency of the peace officer/trooper to the OTOA.
Every officer/trooper who completes the course can apply for a grant reimbursement of the full cost through the office of Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost.

The maximum grant amount per peace officer/trooper is \$750, to be reimbursed to the employing law enforcement agency AFTER successful completion of the course.

How does the agency get reimbursed?
Step 1: Contact OTOA to register tactical team members.
Step 2: Complete the training.
Step 3: Complete AD Grant Request Form.
Step 4: Pay OTOA for training.

OTOA Tactical Team Response to Active Threats - Course number 2207103

The 16 CPT credit hours can be applied in one of two ways:
• 16 hours of general CPT credit
• 3 hours of school-threat safety training and 13 hours of general CPT credit

The OTOA Tactical Team Response to Active Threat 16-hour course provides tactical teams with principles and tactics to respond to an active threat event.

The course was developed for the tactical team members to accomplish their primary mission of Saving Lives successfully. It is one of the only training programs that combine classroom evidence-based principles with practical skills-based tactics.

The class culminates with safe, reality-based scenarios that include de-escalation tactics. The Active Threat principles and tactics are evidence-based.

Additional topics will include constitutional use of force, de-escalation tactics, and linking up with additional and plainclothes officers.

Students will demonstrate proficiency through reality-based scenarios.

Goals

- Understand current trends in active threat incidents.
- Understand the concept of "active duty" and why Rapid Deployment and Immediate Action is needed to save lives.

Demonstrate proficiency in the OTOA mission-driven tactics.

This course is restricted to CPTIC-certified peace officers, and troopers assigned full-time or part-time to a law enforcement tactical team are eligible to participate in CPT approved School-Response Training for Members of Ohio Law Enforcement Tactical Teams.

This training is approved by the Ohio Peace Officers Training Academy (OPOTA) for 16 credit hours of 2023 Continued Professional Training (CPT)

This Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission-approved training course and curriculum are eligible for 100% tuition reimbursement through the Office of Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost and the Officer School Safety Grants program.

The maximum grant amount per peace officer/trooper is \$750, to be paid to the employing law enforcement agency

This document, along with the attached documents, are the requested records for the Officer Involved Shooting incident of August 23rd, 2023, involving Youngstown Police Department OFFICERS [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] acting in their capacity as Tactical Operators with the MAHONING VALLEY CRISIS RESPONSE TEAM SWAT (MVCRT SWAT).

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This preparedness is achieved through the following:

- Since 2003, Tactical Operators attend training two days a month: with those days being generally one tactics day and one firearms / range day.
- Marksman / Observers generally conduct an extra day on sniper aspects.
- A forty hour “SWAT WEEK” is conducted to bring together the years’ worth of training and operational aspects into a scenario-based event.
- Crisis Negotiator Officers attend training one day a month and participate in extra events such as role-playing for local CIT classes and the FBI Basic Negotiator Course.
- Tactical Medical Unit members conduct and participate in various training events.
- Tactical Operation Center members participate in various training events throughout the year.

The next layer of being mission capable is to ensure that the training being conducted is accomplishing the goal of enabling the MVCRT SWAT to be prepared for the high -risk, high -stress situations they may have to respond to.

To accomplish this, the yearly training plan is based on the following four tenets:

1. **Behavior Based.** Human behavior, such as reacting to direct gunfire as one example, when examined in detail will show repeated trends and tendencies as to how people generally react. Training curriculum is then developed to maximize the positive human reactions and minimize the negative reactions.
2. **Scenario Based.** Potential situations that the MVCRT SWAT could respond to are recreated to replicate those situations, with multiple aspects and possible outcomes that could occur. It creates a tough and realistic training environment that mirrors real-life operational conditions.
3. **Retainable.** The tactics and techniques developed are basic as possible, so they can be easily retained and rehearsed.
4. **Repeatable.** The tactics and techniques that are utilized not only can be replicated in a training environment, but during an extremely high stress incident such as an Active Threat or Hostage Rescue situation.

As stated, this document is to put into context the training philosophy of the MVCRT SWAT, and the methodology, to achieve mission readiness. Training and training documentation have evolved far past the prior methods such as specific "1,2,3, steps" or hour by hour tasking schedules as examples.

Regarding the Use of Force Policy and training records requested, and how they relate to the four tenets of training explained, the following are enclosed on this USB drive:

1. MVCRT SWAT Operating Guide Use of Force Policy.
2. Operation Order Use of Force briefing section.
3. Certificates / Course descriptions from FOUR training courses that include both Constitutional, Supreme Court, and policy related Use of Force considerations as part of the curriculum.
4. Two visual and verbal matrix's / charts with Use of Force considerations and options.
5. Available duty rifle qualifications.

This document, along with the enclosed various documents, are the requested records for the Officer Involved Shooting incident of August 23rd, 2023, involving Youngstown Police Department OFFICERS [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] acting in their capacity as Tactical Operators with the MAHONING VALLEY CRISIS RESPONSE TEAM SWAT (MVCRT SWAT).

To preface the requested Use of Force Policy documents, and the MVCRT SWAT team training associated with these documents and Use of Force in general, the first portion of this document will address the MVCRT SWAT operational and training philosophy of the team, and how it then relates specifically to Use of Force training within the team.

The MVCRT SWAT conducts both operations and training based on “principles”. The goal of utilizing principles is to employ a system of tactics and techniques that are applicable to every situation that the MVCRT SWAT responds to. These principles include, but are not limited to, concepts such as safety of hostages as a priority, utilizing negotiation techniques that are proven, and tactical movement that can be utilized in a warrant arrest as well as a hostage rescue.

To ensure that the MVCRT SWAT is mission capable to respond to and effectively mitigate critical situations such as the Howland Township OIS incident, team and individual training of every member is critical to being prepared.

This preparedness is achieved through the following:

- Since 2003, Tactical Operators attend training two days a month: with those days being generally one tactics day and one firearms / range day.
- Marksman / Observers generally conduct an extra day on sniper aspects.
- A forty hour “SWAT WEEK” is conducted to bring together the years’ worth of training and operational aspects into a scenario-based event.
- Crisis Negotiator Officers attend training one day a month and participate in extra events such as role-playing for local CIT classes and the FBI Basic Negotiator Course.
- Tactical Medical Unit members conduct and participate in various training events.
- Tactical Operation Center members participate in various training events throughout the year.

The next layer of being mission capable is to ensure that the training being conducted is accomplishing the goal of enabling the MVCRT SWAT to be prepared for the high -risk, high -stress situations they may have to respond to.

To accomplish this, the yearly training plan is based on the following four tenets:

1. Behavior based. Human behavior, such as reacting to direct gunfire, when examined in detail will show repeated trends and tendencies as to how people generally react. Training courses are then developed to maximize the positive human reactions and minimize the negative reactions.

2. Scenario based. Potential situations that the MVCRT SWAT could respond to are recreated to replicate those situations, with multiple aspects and possible outcomes that could occur. It creates a tough and realistic training environment that mirrors real-life operational conditions.
3. Retainable. The tactics and techniques developed are basic as possible, so they can be easily retained.
4. Repeatable. The tactics and techniques that are utilized not only can be replicated in a training environment, but during an extremely high stress incident such as an Active Threat or Hostage Rescue situation.

Regarding the Use of Force policy and training records requested, and how they relate to the four tenets of training explained, the following are enclosed:

1. MVCRT SWAT Operating Guide Use of Force Policy.
2. Operation Order Use of Force briefing section.
3. Certificates / Course descriptions from FOUR training courses that include both Constitutional, Supreme Court, and policy related Use of Force considerations as part of the curriculum.
4. Two visual and verbal matrix's / charts with Use of Force considerations and options.
5. Available duty rifle qualifications.

HIGH THREAT CQC

The High Threat Close Quarter Contacts (CQC) provides one basic, principle-based method of searching and building entry suitable for a variety of situations up to and including "High Threat" missions. The system combines initial limited penetration or threshold evaluation with cautious or aggressive entry as needed from a tactically superior position using behavior-based methodology.

The same basic principles and techniques are used at varying speeds to deal with all types of Close Quarter Contacts situations: deliberate, dynamic, stealth, and hostage rescue. High Threat CQC is suitable for solo operators and small teams to multi-team operations with foundational techniques that span the capabilities of the entry-level law enforcement up to military personnel or elite-level SWAT and Special Operation Teams. This course focuses on personnel management, less-lethal options and conflict de-escalation techniques. It is currently in use as the primary method of numerous large departments, federal teams, state level basic training academies, tactical training organizations, and military specialized units.

High Threat CQC gives personnel the skill and confidence needed to address the simplest or most serious threats while maintaining superior survivability and operational flexibility leading to decreased liability. The behavior-based nature of the program means that personnel are not required to abandon their common sense or intuitive survival sense, forcing them to use a close-range "kill or be killed" tactic that is often provably abandoned upon contact with a determined defender, or worse, forcing a shooting situation when none is required. Users who have been exposed to our methods most often say "It just makes sense," and often wonder why they were ever taught the traditional immediate entry dynamic method, which too many have seen fail.

Who is eligible for the Tactical Team Response to Active Threat Course?

The OTOA Tactical Team Response to Active Threat 16-hour course provides tactical teams with principles and tactics to respond to an active threat event.

SPECIFIC LEGAL GUIDANCE

ALL ASSISTING DEPARTMENTS SHOULD BE AWARE OF, AND ADHERE TO, THEIR INTERNAL POLICY REGARDING USE OF FORCE

A. MVCRT (SWAT) DEADLY FORCE POLICY:

Deadly force may be used only when necessary, that is, when the MVCRT MEMBER has a reasonable belief that the subject of such force poses an imminent danger of death or serious physical injury to the officer or another person. Deadly force may not be used solely to prevent the escape of a fleeing suspect and firearms may not be used solely to disable a moving vehicle. Verbal warnings to submit to the authority of the agent shall be given prior to the use of deadly force if feasible and if doing so would not increase the danger to the officer or others. Warning shots are not permitted.

B. MVCRT (SWAT) ON THE USE OF LESS-THAN-LETHAL DEVICES:

MVCRT MEMBERS are authorized to use less-than-lethal devices (impact devices, chemical agents, and conducted energy devices) only in those situations where reasonable force, based on the totality of the circumstances at the time of the incident, is necessary to effectuate an arrest, obtain lawful compliance from a subject, or protect any person from physical harm. Use of less-than-lethal devices must cease when it is no longer necessary to achieve the law enforcement objective. MVCRT MEMBERS are authorized by this policy to use only those less-than-lethal devices which have been authorized by the MVCRT and that they are trained to use, absent exigent circumstances. MVCRT MEMBERS are prohibited from using less-than-lethal devices to punish, harass, or abuse any person. Less-than-lethal devices are to be used with a reasonable expectation that death or serious bodily injury will not result. They are, however, recognized as having the potential to cause death or serious bodily injury, so proper deployment will be used. MVCRT MEMBERS must make necessary medical assistance available to subjects of less-than-lethal device use as soon as practicable.

C. PROBABLE CAUSE RE PRESENCE OF SUBJECT ON PREMISES (ARRESTS):

If the residence of the subject or the residence of a third party is to be entered to arrest the subject, MVCRT MEMBERS are to have facts and circumstances amounting to probable cause that the subject is on the premises at the time the warrant is executed.

D. KNOCK AND ANNOUNCE RULE:

Absent exigent circumstances, MVCRT MEMBERS executing arrest and search warrants are to "knock and announce" their identity, authority and purpose and demand to enter prior to making entry. The waiting period to make entry is judged on a reasonableness standard based on a totality of the circumstances. If entry is refused, forced entry should be immediate. Exigent circumstances, which would permit noncompliance with the knock and announce requirement, are recognized where MVCRT MEMBERS (1) have a reasonable suspicion that knocking and announcing would cause the MVCRT MEMBERS and/or another person to be placed in imminent peril of bodily harm; (2) would be a useless or futile gesture where persons within the premises already know of the MVCRT MEMBERS presence, identity, authority, and purpose; (3) would cause evidence sought under the warrant to be destroyed or removed; (4) or would permit the escape of a person the MVCRT MEMBERS seeks to arrest.



Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Standard Operating Guidelines

- 5.03.1** The Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team places the highest value on safety of its members and on the safety of the public. The team regulations, policies and procedures are designed to ensure this value guides these members in their use of force.

Due to the nature of the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team duties and responsibilities, its members respond to situations that are considered to be high-risk. The amount of force used, whether maximum or minimum is dependent upon the facts and circumstances surrounding each situation.

No policy or procedure for lethal or less lethal force can possibly cover every situation. All members of the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team are expected to respond decisively using the highest level of good judgment, restraint, and professional competence, whatever the level of necessary force.

- 5.03.2** Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members will receive instruction and must satisfactorily show a working knowledge and proficiency with all force options that are employed by the individual team member. Training documentation and qualifications will meet or exceed the minimum standards of the Ohio Peace Officers Training Commission. Certified instructors, with occasional assistance from recognized tactical experts, will be used to conduct and document training. The Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team will maintain members training records as well as provide a copy to their home agency. Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members are not authorized to employ a force option that they have not completed the necessary training.

5.03.3 Definitions

- **Lethal Force:** Is that degree of force likely to result in death or serious physical injury. The discharge of a firearm toward a person is an example of the use of deadly force.
- **Less Lethal Force:** Is the force that is neither likely nor intended to cause serious physical harm or death. This includes the use of approved defensive/physical tactics, approved chemical agents, approved electronic control devices, approved impact weapons, and police canines.
- **Minimum Amount of Force:** The minimum amount of force is the least amount of force that is proper, reasonable, and necessary to achieve a lawful objective.
- **Reasonable Belief:** Are known facts and circumstances that would cause an ordinary and prudent person to act or think in a similar way under similar circumstances.
- **Serious Bodily Harm:** This is bodily injury that creates a substantial risk of death, permanent disfigurement, or long-term loss or impairment of any body part or organ.
- **Electronic Control Device:** Weapons designed to disrupt a subject's central nervous system by means of deploying battery powered electrical energy sufficient to cause uncontrolled muscle contractions and override an individual's voluntary motor responses.
- **Vascular Neck Restraint:** Defined as compressing one or both sides of a person's neck with an arm or leg, without applying direct pressure to the trachea of airway (front of the neck). A vascular neck restraint is considered lethal force.

- **Choke Hold:** Defined as applying direct pressure on a person's trachea or airway (front of the neck), blocking or obstructing the airway. A choke hold is considered lethal force.
- **Chemical Agent:** Chemical agents are intended and designed to be used as disabling agents, for law enforcement officers and correctional personnel to use to attempt to overcome resistance, and to subdue persons with minimal injuries to officers, arrestees and others.

5.03.4 Graham vs. Connor

"Because the test of reasonableness under the Fourth Amendment is not capable of precise definition or mechanical application, its proper application requires careful attention to the facts and circumstances of each particular case, including:

- The severity of the crime at issue,
- Whether the suspect poses an immediate threat to the safety of the officers or others, and;
- Whether he/she is actively resisting or attempting to evade arrest by flight.

The "reasonableness" of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of *the reasonable officer* on the scene, rather than with 20/20 vision of hindsight. The calculus of reasonableness must embody allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second judgments – in circumstances that are tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving – about the amount of force that is necessary in a particular situation."

5.03.5 Authorized Use of Force

Reasonable force may be used upon or toward the person of another without the other's consent when the following circumstances exist or the actor reasonably believes them to exist and when used by an officer or one assisting an officer under the officer's direction:

- In effecting a lawful arrest
- In the execution of a legal process
- In enforcing an order of the court
- In executing any other duty imposed upon the officer by law

5.03.6 Action-Response Continuum

The Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team uses the Action-Response Continuum. This model shows the varied levels of subject resistance and the appropriate subject control response. This continuum is a model only, and the officer's control response should be based on the subject's actions and the officer's ability to articulate the perception of the threat.

Any force used by an officer shall be the minimum degree reasonably necessary to overcome the subject's level of resistance in order to affect lawful objectives in accordance with state law and institutional policy. Officers are not permitted to use more force than is necessary, and shall use the minimum amount necessary to control the subject at the time.

The totality of the circumstances surrounding an officer's encounter with a resisting subject shall be considered in determining the appropriate level of force to be used in a particular instance. The level of force will depend on the response of the subject and the circumstances. Nothing in this model is intended to require that the model be followed in successive steps. Obviously, to require that would jeopardize the safety of both the officers and the community served. Officers must, however, be able to articulate in writing the need that they perceived at the time the force was deployed to escalate to the level of force they chose to use in response to the threat.

Once the threat or resistance displayed by the subject stops or diminishes, force by the officer in response, should diminish or cease. An officer's proper use of force is determined by what a subject is doing at the time, not what may have occurred previously. No amount of force is authorized in taking an action that an officer knows is illegal or malicious.

5.03.7 Threatening the Use of Force

As an alternative and/or the precursor to the actual use of force, Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members may verbally announce their intent to use force. Members may also display an authorized weapon as a threat of force.

5.03.8 Authorized Use of Lethal Force

The use of lethal force by an officer is justified only when necessary:

- To protect the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team member or another from apparent death or serious bodily harm;
- To effect the arrest or capture, or prevent the escape, of a person whom the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team member knows or has reasonable grounds to believe has committed or attempted to commit a felony involving the use or threatened use of lethal force
- To effect the arrest or capture, or prevent the escape, of a person who the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members knows or has reasonable grounds to believe has committed or attempted to commit a felony, if that member reasonably believes that the person will cause death or serious bodily harm if the person's apprehension is delayed.

Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members shall recognize that:

- Warning shots shall not be fired.
- The use of a firearm, vehicle, less-lethal or non-lethal weapon, or other improvised weapons may constitute the use of lethal force.
- The policy does not prevent a Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team member from drawing a firearm or being prepared to use a firearm in threatening situations.
- The Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Commander may set rules of engagement to maintain scene security to protect officers or the public from death or serious bodily harm.

5.03.9 Use of Unauthorized Weapons

Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members shall only carry and use approved weapons for which they are currently trained and authorized to use. If an exigent circumstance exists that poses an imminent threat to the safety of the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members or the public requiring the immediate use of an improvised weapon of opportunity, that member may use the weapon.

5.03.10 Use of Vascular Neck Restraints (Choke Holds)

The use of a choke hold or vascular neck restraint is considered deadly force action and only should be utilized when the officer reasonably believes that the action is necessary in defense of human life, including the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team member's own life, or in defense of any person in imminent danger of serious physical injury, and in accordance with U.S. and Ohio Court decisions, specifically, *Tennessee v. Garner* and *Graham v. Connor*.

5.03.11 Civil Disturbances

Civil disturbances are unique situations that often require special planning and tactics to best bring an unlawful situation under effective control. The on-scene Incident Commander shall evaluate the overall situation and determine if it would be a reasonable force option to use less-lethal or non-lethal weapons to best accomplish that objective. This decision shall be approved by the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Commander.

If there is an immediate need to protect oneself or another from apparent physical harm, Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members may deploy less-lethal or non-lethal weapons upon the individuals involved in a civil disturbance. However, the normal operating procedure would be for Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members to refrain from deployment until it has been authorized by Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Command.

5.03.12 Use of Chemical Agents

The use of chemical agents is considered to be a less-lethal use of force. The use of chemical agents shall be consistent with current Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team, home department, and manufacturer training standards. Members using chemical agents must provide the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Commander with documentation of current certification for the specific chemical agent that will be used by the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team member. Use of chemical agents to accomplish a tactical advantage shall be authorized by the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team command. Post exposure treatment for individuals that have been exposed to chemical agents shall include:

- Removing the affected person(s) from the area of exposure.
- Exposing the affected person(s) to fresh air.
- Render medical aid consistent with training. Always wear appropriate personal protective equipment.
- Rinsing the eyes/skin of the affected person(s) with cool water (if available).
- Render medical aid consistent with training
- Request Tactical Emergency Medical Support Unit /EMS for evaluation

Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members shall keep a person exposed to the chemical agent under close observation until they are released to medical personnel.

5.03.13 Use of Electronic Control Devices (ECD):

The use of Electronic Control Devices is considered to be a less-lethal use of force. The use of Electronic Control Devices shall be consistent with current Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team, home department, and manufacturer training standards. Members using Electronic Control Devices must provide the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Commander with documentation of current certification for the specific device that will be used by the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team member.

The Electronic Control Device can ignite flammable substances and gases. The Electronic Control Device shall not be deployed anytime there is a reasonable belief that a flammable substance or gas is present and may ignite.

Treatment for a person(s) on which the Electronic Control Device was used shall include the following:

- Render medical aid consistent with. Always wear appropriate personal protective equipment.
- Remove probes from the person's non-sensitive areas.
- Secure the probes (biohazard "sharps") point down into the expended cartridge and seal with tape.
- When appropriate, visually inspect probe entry sites and/or drive stun locations for signs of injury.

- Request Tactical Emergency Medical Support Unit /EMS for evaluation and for probe removal if probes are located in a sensitive area (face, neck, groin or breast areas).

Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members shall keep a person on which the Electronic Control Device was used under close observation until they are released to medical or other law enforcement personnel.

5.03.14 Use of Impact Weapons

The use of impact weapons are considered to be a less-lethal use of force. The use of impact weapons shall be consistent with current Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team, home department, and manufacturer training standards. Members using Impact Weapons must provide the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Commander with documentation of current certification for the specific weapon that will be used by the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team member. Treatment for a person that has been struck with an impact weapon shall include the following:

- Render medical aid consistent with. Always wear appropriate personal protective equipment
- When appropriate, visually inspect the impact area for signs of injury
- Determine if the person is injured or requires medical treatment
- Request Tactical Emergency Medical Support Unit /EMS for evaluation

Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members shall keep a person struck by an impact weapon under close observation until they are released to medical or other law enforcement personnel.

5.03.15 Use of Flash and Sound Distraction Devices (FSDD)

The use of flash and sound distraction devices are considered to be a less-lethal use of force. The use of impact weapons shall be consistent with current Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team, home department, and manufacturer training standards. Members using Impact Weapons must provide the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Commander with documentation of current certification for the specific weapon that will be used by the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members. Treatment for a person that has been exposed to a Flash and Sound Distraction Device shall include the following:

- Render medical aid consistent with. Always wear appropriate personal protective equipment
- When appropriate, visually inspect the impact area for signs of injury
- Determine if the person is injured or requires medical treatment
- Request Tactical Emergency Medical Support Unit /EMS for evaluation

Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team members shall keep a person injured by a Flash and Sound Distraction Device under close observation until they are released to medical or other law enforcement personnel.

5.03.16 Use of Force Documentation and Review

When a use of force occurs, the Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Commander shall conduct a preliminary investigation at the scene. The preliminary investigation shall include:

- Having the team member who used force document the incident on a Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team Use of Force Report
- Debriefing the member(s) that engaged in the use of force

- Note any reported injury (real or alleged) to any individual involved in the use of force
- Photograph any visible signs of injury to any individual involved in the use of force
- Note any medical aid rendered to any individual involved in the use of force
- Locating any evidence of the use of force
- Locating witnesses and collecting statements involving the use of force
- Make an assessment to determine if the force used was reasonable.

5.03.17 Investigation When Use of Force Results in a Death or Serious Bodily Harm

Whenever a Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team member uses force that results in a death or an injury that may result in a death, the incident will be investigated by the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation and Identification. The Mahoning Valley Crisis Response Team member's home agency will also be notified who may also wish to exercise their policy on use of force investigations. The following steps will be initiated:

- The scene shall be secured from all non-essential personnel
- All evidence shall be preserved
- The team member(s) involved will be relocated away from the scene







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
