DEAR SIR—You have recently submitted an abstract which was last continued by George C Fairbanks, attorney at law, June 22, 1920, and requested the opinion of this department relative to the status of the following described premises as disclosed by said abstract.

“Situating in the county of Franklin, township of Clinton, and state of Ohio, and being known as lot number sixteen (16) in Wood Brown Place, of record in plat book 5, pages 196 and 197, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio
