APPROVAL, CONTRACT OF STATE OF OHIO WITH THE WOODS CONSTRUCTION AND SUPPLY COMPANY, LIMA, OHIO, FOR CONSTRUCTION OF STATE ARMORY BUILDING AT SHREVE, OHIO, AT A COST OF \$51,400.00—SURETY BOND EXECUTED BY THE UNITED STATES FIDELITY AND GUARANTY COMPANY, BALTIMORE, MARYLAND.

HON. GEORGE FLORENCE, *Adjutant General, Columbus, Ohio.*

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted to me for approval a contract (three copies) between George Florence, Adjutant General of Ohio, and Director of State Armories, and the Woods Construction and Supply Company, a corporation, organized under the laws of the State of Ohio, of Lima, Ohio. This contract is for the construction of a state armory building at Shreve, Ohio, and calls for an expenditure of fifty-one thousand and four hundred dollars (\$51,400.00).

Accompanying said contract is a bond to insure faithful performance, executed by The United States Fidelity & Guaranty Company, of Baltimore, Maryland.

I have before me the certificate of the Director of Finance that there is an unencumbered balance of \$45,000.00 legally appropriated sufficient to cover the obligations of this contract. I am also informed by you that you now have in your possession a certified check for \$7,000.00, representing moneys donated to the state by private persons, which said moneys are available for and are to be applied to the contract in question.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon, and return same to you herewith, together with all other data submitted to me in this connection.
