Summary:

On June 7, 2024, Special Agent Cory Momchilov of the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation submitted the below listed items with an authorization letter to search the contents from Ashtabula County Assistant Prosecutor Dawn Cantalamessa. These items were to be analyzed for evidence relating to the crime of Felonious Assault regarding the subject John Perry.

Submitted Items:

028 - Mobile Phone - Motorola Moto E - XT2052-1

035 - Mobile Phone - Apple iPhone SE (2022) - A2595

Details:

Item 28: Item 28 is a Motorola manufactured mobile phone model XT2052-1 (Moto E). The International Mobile Equipment Identity (IMEI) number associated with Item 28 is 351636112581364 and the serial number is ZY22BD32DV. Item 28 has an advertised internal storage capacity of 32 Gigabytes (GB) and is capable of additional storage through the use of a micro Secure Digital (SD) card. No additional storage was submitted with Item 28. Item 28 was placed into airplane mode to suspend wireless communications. Item 28 is locked with an unknown passcode. The device was connected to a forensic tool capable of determining the passcode. The passcode for the device is 2212. The device was connected to a forensic tool capable of obtaining a file system extraction from the device. The extraction was then loaded into Cellebrite Physical Analyzer, a software package that converts the data to an easily readable format.

Item 28a: Item 28a is a Visible branded Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card bearing the Integrated Circuit Card Identifier (ICCID) 89148000006692541087.

Item 35: Item 35 is an Apple manufactured mobile phone model A2595 (iPhone SE (2022)). The IMEI numbers associated with Item 35 are 354140915858688 and 354140915702357 and the serial number is M72603JPM4. Item 35 has an advertised internal storage capacity of 64 GB and is not capable of additional storage. Item 35 is locked with an unknown four (4) digit passcode. Item 35 was unlocked with the passcode recovered from Item 28 (2212). Item 35 was placed into airplane mode to suspend wireless communications. The device was connected to a forensic tool capable of obtaining a file system extraction from the device. The extraction was then loaded into Cellebrite Physical Analyzer, a software package that converts the data to an easily readable format.

Findings:

Item 28: The passcode recovered for Item 28 is 2212. The Google account associated with Item 28 is johnbusterperry@gmail.com. The last recorded date that indicates Item 28 was in use is September 10, 2023. It is necessary to note that during the extraction process some of Item 28's system files were updated to reflect the dates of the attempted extractions. Attachment A contains one (1) Cellebrite UFDR file. In order to view the content of the UFDR file double-click the CellebriteReader.exe and the UFDR will auto populate. Once the Cellebrite Reader is open the content can be examined and any additional reports can be generated.

Item 28a: The phone number associated with Item 28a is 440-336-0487.

Item 35: The passcode for Item 35 is 2212. The Apple ID associated with Item 35 chiap10@icloud.com. The last recorded CCID used with 35 ltem is 89148000009670137977. The phone number associated with Item 35 440-307-0685. The last recorded date that indicates Item 35 was in use is December 13, 2023. It is necessary to note that during the extraction process some of Item 35's system files were updated to reflect the date of the extraction. Attachment B contains one (1) Cellebrite UFDR file. In order to view the content of the UFDR file double-click the CellebriteReader.exe and the UFDR will auto populate. Once the Cellebrite Reader is open the content can be examined and any additional reports can be generated.
