The Appellee Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicle's (BMV) motion to dismiss for lack of subject matter jurisdiction came before the court for consideration. The court has reviewed the Appellee's motion and memorandum in support. The Appellant Robert Alan Fisher Jr. has not responded to the motion.

After consideration of the arguments presented, it is the finding of this court that pursuant to R.C. Section 119.12, the Appellant's Notice of Appeal was untimely filed. In addition, the Appellant's appeal is defective in that it fails to state that the order of the BMV was not supported by reliable, probative, and substantial evidence and is not in accordance with the law as required by R.C. Section 119.12. For all of the foregoing reasons the Appellee's motion to dismiss this case for lack of subject matter jurisdiction is granted. Case closed. Costs to the Appellant.
