

Concealed Carry Reciprocity Agreement
Between the State of New Mexico and the State of Ohio

Whereas the State of New Mexico and the State of Ohio (the "Parties") each wish to provide for their respective concealed carry licenses to possess concealed weapons while in the jurisdiction of the other, each state hereby agrees as follows:

1. Findings: The Cabinet Secretary for the New Mexico Department of Public Safety hereby determines that concealed carry reciprocity with the State of Ohio is appropriate under the provisions of NMSA 1978 Section 29-19-12(E) and related sections of New Mexico law.

The Ohio Attorney General hereby determines that a concealed carry reciprocity agreement with the State of New Mexico is appropriate under the provisions of Ohio Rev. Code § 109.69.

2. Reciprocity: The State of New Mexico hereby agrees to recognize the Ohio License to Carry a Concealed Handgun as valid within the state of New Mexico pursuant to NMSA 1978 Section 29-19-12(E) and related sections of New Mexico law.

The State of Ohio hereby agrees to recognize the New Mexico License to Carry a Concealed Weapon as valid within the state of Ohio pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code § 109.69.

3. Binding Law: The licensees of each state, while within the jurisdiction of the other, shall be obliged to comply with all of the foreign state's laws regarding possession, transportation, storage, and use of concealed weapons, and all other applicable laws except those regarding issuance, suspension, revocation, and renewal of concealed weapons licenses, which matters shall remain within the exclusive power of the issuing state.

4. Termination: This Agreement shall remain in effect in perpetuity, or until such time as


statutory authority for this agreement is withdrawn by the legislature of either Party, or until this Agreement is terminated in writing by either Party upon thirty (30) days notice.

5. License Verification: Each state shall make available to law enforcement officers of the other a means to immediately verify the authenticity and status of that state's concealed carry licenses.

New Mexico Concealed Handgun Licenses can be verified through an NLET CWQ inquiry.

Ohio Licenses to Carry Concealed Handguns can be verified through a NLET CWQ inquiry.
